1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 To report to the HNL Committee the receipt of a petition from some residents living in part of Amity Street and Cholmeley Road.

1.2 Attached as Appendix 1 is a location plan and at Appendix 2 a copy of petition.

3.1 The provision of waste collections is specified within Environmental Protection Act 1990.

4. THE PROPOSAL

4.1 A petition containing 21 signatures has been received from some residents in Amity Street and Cholmeley Road requesting a communal bin.

The petition reads - "We are the residents living in part of Amity Street and Cholmeley Road, Reading. We wish to bring our inconvenience and hygiene concern issue to your notice. We are advised to place rubbish

bags each week for collection. The rubbish bags are being laid in the footpath even in rainy time. This not only gives ugly picture to our streets, but also raises hygiene concern.

None of us want rubbish bags being laid over the footpath. Hence, we submit this petition with a request for a communal bin."

4.2 The issues raised within this petition are to be fully investigated and a future report is to be submitted to the HNL Committee for consideration.
