

OUR AMBITIONS FOR 2016 BETTER SERVICE

- Complete the £830,000 capital development programme to improve the gym, changing rooms, reception, Thames Suite and Better Coffee Corner to raise customer satisfaction.
- Improve our performance score in the Annual User Survey to achieve a minimum score of 80 %
- Introduce smaller, pop-up fitness class within the gym to improve the user experience.
- To deliver nationally recognised Sport England quality benchmark of Quest Plus rating via independent audit

BETTER PEOPLE

- Working in partnership with GLL College, improve opportunities for training and development by implementing the GLL Skills Academy, National Apprenticeship and Trainee Manager schemes.
- Improve internal communication channels and maximise efficiency and interaction of all team members with the launch of the GLL staff intranet.
- Increase employment of Apprentices, with a target of 30% of frontline staff employed on the apprenticeship programme by the end of 2017.
- Encourage local democracy with more employees becoming members of the GLL Industrial & Provident Society by holding staff briefing events including breakfast meetings and AGM/Society Roadshows at Rivermead.



OUR AMBITIONS FOR 2016 BETTER COMMUNITIES

- As an official sponsor for Sport Relief, work with staff and customers at Rivermead to achieve a fundraising target of £500,000.
- Develop a strategy to work in partnership with Reading Borough Council's Adult Learning Services team for the relocation of its Day Care service.
- Increase the number of athletes supported by the GLL Sports Foundation in Reading to 40. Increase 'Be Inspired' participation to 400 per event to create pathway opportunities for younger children.

BETTER BUSINESS

- Promote the new gym product and the £19.95 membership architecture to grow membership to 2,000 members.
- Promote the benefits of online booking, 'Home Portal' and improved swimming facilities to grow the swimming lesson programme to 750.
- Introduce improved catering facilities and Better Coffee Corner brand that will encourage repeat business and social engagement for customers.
- Work in partnership with Reading Borough Council to enable the building of a demountable 25 metre
 pool and teaching pool at Rivermead.

satisfaction level score of 100%







BETTER PEOP

- The Fitness Instructor team all receive vocational training in group exercise class delivery, including specialisms such as Buggy-a-cise and chair based exercises for older people
- The GLL staff intranet launches in January 2016
- GLL become a nationally accredited deliverer of Apprenticeship programmes, with Rivermead beginning plans to create 3 new apprentice roles in year one
- Rivermead hosted the regional roadshow for the Annual General Meeting of the GLL Staff Society

BETTER COMMUNITIES

- ANPR Car Parking introduced in January this has seen a significant drop in 'boy racer' incidents in the car park
- Ongoing work in partnership with Reading Borough Council for the relocation of the 'Maples' adult learning services day care centre
- In March Rivermead raised over £2,500 from local fundraising initiatives, with GLL raising an overall total of almost £400,000 for Sport Relief
- Team Rivermead compete in the inaugural Club games in May and win the overall competition
- Launched a partnership project with Age UK Berkshire to introduce walking football









BETTER BUSINESS

- Better Coffee Corner launches successfully in January
- Better Swim School has grown from 522 to 780 participants in 2016
- The £19.95 membership price model is widely marketed across the local region
- Rivermead has hosted several large scale local and national events, including Disabled Living, Reading Contemporary Art Fair and 'Robot Wars' Live
