The Council is looking at opportunities to improve enforcement of existing parking areas including quicker detection of illegally parked vehicles by upgrading the enforcement (CCTV) vehicle. The use of new technology would enable intelligence led enforcement which would improve the efficiencies of the Civil Enforcement Officers' deployment across the whole Borough.
