
# NCN Route 422 Update

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### WHAT IS NCN 422

- New cycle route between Newbury and Ascot
- Approximately 30 miles across four Local Authority areas
- Developed in partnership with Wokingham,
   West Berkshire & Bracknell





## NATIONAL CYCLE NETWORK

- Over 14,000 miles of cycling and walking routes in the UK promoted by Sustrans
- 5 million people use the network per year
- Over 27 million trips are made by children travelling to/from school
- 20% of cyclists are new to cycling or starting to cycle again
- Three existing NCN routes in Reading



#### NCN 422 - BACKGROUND

- Feasibility study undertaken by Sustrans in 2013 to identify route
- Scheme developed in consultation with user groups
- Scheme funded by the LEP
  - Reading LEP £1.2 million + £100k S106
- Expected completion of the full scheme in Spring 2019



## NCN 422 - READING SECTION


- Connecting people to key destinations:






# PHASE 1 - HONEY END LANE



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


## PHASE 2 - ROUTE

- Upgrade advisory cycle lanes to mandatory
- Extend off-carriageway facilities along A33 to Bath Road
- Address conflicts on Bridge Street
- Improve connectivity to Kennet Side
- Provide alternative routes along busy routes
- Continue to highlight presence of vulnerable users through imprinting & enhanced signing





## PHASE 3 - PROPOSED ROUTES





#### **NEXT STEPS**

- Complete construction of Phase 1 works
- Develop Phases 2 & 3 in consultation with Ward Councillors and user groups
- Continue delivery of cycle and walking facilities in line with the Council's adopted LTP Cycling Strategy & Implementation Plans (Item 18)
