#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT AND EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report sets out the arrangements to be made in accordance with Section 78 of the Coronavirus Act 2020 [the Act] and 'the Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020' [the Regulations] to postpone or cancel the Annual Council Meeting, which had been due to take place on 2 June 2020.
- 1.2 The Act and Regulations have made provision for local authorities to allow meetings to occur without the participants being in the same place. Local authority meetings can take place under the Regulations with members in more than one place, including at electronic, digital or virtual locations such as internet locations, web addresses or conference call telephone numbers. However, it is recommended that this year's Annual Council Meeting should be cancelled on the grounds of the complexity involved in holding a ceremonial meeting of this kind and given that the Regulations allow for this eventuality.
- 1.3 Online meetings will take place and the Policy Committee at its meeting on 27 April 2020 agreed protocols for the Policy Committee, Planning Applications Committee and Licensing Applications Sub-Committees 1 and 2 to continue to meet under the new arrangements set out in the Regulations. The Council along with its other Committees, Sub-Committees and consultative bodies will cease to meet for the time being.
- 1.4 Section 78(3) of the Act paved the way for the Regulations in relation to local authority meetings required to be held, or held, before 7 May 2021. The Assistant Director of Legal and Democratic Services or Policy Committee will also be able to end or make

amendments to the arrangements prior to 7 May 2021. The Regulations can be viewed through the following link:

#### 2. RECOMMENDED ACTION

- 2.1 That, in accordance with Regulation 6(c) of the Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020, the Annual Council Meeting due to be held on 2 June 2020 be cancelled until such time as guidance on social distancing allows;
- 2.2 That, in accordance with Standing Order 3, notice be given that the Leader of Council shall petition the Chief Executive (Head of Paid Service) to call an Extraordinary Council Meeting for the purpose of confirming the appointment of the Mayor, at the appropriate time;
- 2.3 That, subject to formal confirmation at an Extraordinary Council Meeting, Councillor David Stevens be appointed Mayor of this Borough and Councillor Rachel Eden be appointed Deputy Mayor for the 2020/21 Municipal Year;
- 2.4 That the appointments set out below be confirmed:

#### 3. POLICY CONTEXT

- 3.1 To enable the Council to fulfil its leadership role at this incredibly challenging time, and to guide its work with partners in providing the support that residents and businesses need, the Council's current Corporate Plan priorities have been reframed to provide clarity of purpose and the three point strategic framework that has been adopted is based around the following three broad priorities:
  - To support and protect vulnerable children and adults by ensuring the social care system continues to function effectively;
  - To support the people who are most vulnerable and isolated in our communities;
  - To support businesses and the local economy, and secure Reading's economic recovery.
- 3.2 The Government has passed legislation which enables this year's Annual Council Meeting to be postponed or cancelled and any appointments currently in place to be allowed to continue until the next Annual Meeting takes place. There is also the ability to hold an Annual Meeting as planned or review decisions at a later meeting in the Municipal Year.

#### 4. THE PROPOSAL

- 4.1 The Annual Council Meeting or 'Mayor Making' is held in May/ June each year. This year due to the Covid-19 pandemic the Government has issued Regulations that remove the requirement on local authorities to hold their Annual Council Meeting. The Council is not prevented from holding an annual meeting in 2020, if it wishes to do so, but the legislative requirement has been relaxed.
- 4.2 In addition, the Regulations allow appointments that would otherwise be made or are required to be made at the annual meeting of a local authority, to continue until the next annual meeting or until such time as that authority may determine. This appears to cover the election of The Mayor and appointment of the Deputy Mayor. Therefore, the appointments currently in place could be allowed to continue until the next Annual Meeting or they could be reviewed at an earlier meeting if preferred.
- 4.3 In view of the current Covid-19 emergency, it is recommended that in the main the appointments made at the Council meeting held on 22 May 2019 should be allowed to remain in force, with the ability to review those appointments at a later Council meeting or other Committee during the 2020/21 Municipal Year, if appropriate.
- 4.4 The Annual Council Meeting also sets up the Council's Committees and other bodies for the forthcoming year and confirms their powers and duties. It is also recommended that these should remain largely unchanged for the 2020/21 Municipal Year or until the Council decides it is able to review them.

4.5 In the main the current appointments will remain in place until the next Annual Meeting or until they can be considered at an earlier Council Meeting, if preferred. However, there are changes as a result of this report, some of which will be subject to confirmation at a future Council meeting where necessary. These changes are highlighted in bold text.

- The Annual Council Meeting also considers changes to the Constitution; Delegations 4.6 including the Monitoring Officer's ability to grant a general dispensation to members in certain circumstances; and a motion to agree the dates of the Council meetings for the forthcoming year. As a result of the current Covid-19 pandemic, it is recommended that the Constitution and any other matters that were due to be considered remain unchanged until such time that the Council decides to review them. - 4.7 The Annual Council Meeting is immediately followed by meetings of the Policy Committee, Strategic Environment, Planning & Transport Committee and the Licensing Applications Committee to make appointments to their Sub-Committees and some outside organisations. It is recommended that these appointments, which include the Chairs and Vice-Chairs of The Mapledurham Playing Fields Trustees' Sub-Committee, Traffic Management Sub-Committee and the Licensing Applications Sub-Committee 3 are mostly unchanged for the forthcoming Municipal Year, as follows:

Similarly, there are relatively few changes recommended to the outside bodies schedule from the previous year. The updated list of outside body appointments for 2020/21 is attached at Appendix B for approval.

4.8 Attached at Appendix C to the report are two calendars of meetings for 2020/21, which have been prepared to hold a reduced number of online meetings as agreed at Policy Committee on 27 April 2020 (currently scheduled for up to the end of August 2020) and a possible full schedule of meetings in preparation for the lifting of restrictions in relation to the Covid-19 pandemic.

The second 'full' calendar is currently scheduled from September 2020, as this is when the autumn "cycle" of committee meetings starts, in the hope that, by then, it may be possible to restore meetings to nearer normality, but the holding of any meetings in person will be subject to the receipt of any further guidance and consideration of the health and safety of all those involved.

The calendars may therefore need further amendment as and when appropriate.

#### 5. CONTRIBUTION TO STRATEGIC AIMS

- 5.1 The Council's reframed three broad priorities, as set out above, are consistent with the Council's Corporate Plan priorities and strategic aims.
- 5.2 The Corporate Plan Priorities are:
  - 1. Securing the economic success of Reading and provision of job opportunities
  - 2. Ensuring access to decent housing to meet local needs
  - 3. To protect and enhance the lives of vulnerable adults and children
  - 4. Keeping Reading's environment clean, green and safe
  - 5. Ensuring that there are good education, leisure and cultural opportunities for people in Reading
  - 6. Ensuring the Council is fit for the future
- 5.3 The re-appointment of Councillors to specific leadership roles, including Committees and as representatives on outside organisations will ensure continuity at this difficult time and support the Council's focus on its strategic aims and the reframed three broad priorities set out in paragraph 3.1 above. The governance of the Council and the contribution it makes to the delivery of effective decisions and its business management is a key component for the delivery of the Council's strategic aims.

#### 6. ENVIRONMENTAL AND CLIMATE IMPLICATIONS

6.1 The Council declared a Climate Emergency at its meeting on 26 February 2019 (Minute 48 refers). There are no specific environmental and climate implications to report in relation to the recommendations set out in this report.

#### 7. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND INFORMATION

7.1 Section 138 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 places a duty on local authorities to involve local representatives when carrying out "any of its functions" by providing information, consulting or "involving in another way". This report recommends largely retaining continuity of membership and appointments for the forthcoming year as a means to avoid unnecessary disruption to councillors' representational roles at this challenging time.

- 8.1 Under the Equality Act 2010, Section 149, a public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to—
