Background

This is an application for the grant of a new Premises Licence for The Hut located at 39 St Mary’s Butts, Reading RG1 2LG by Mr Kamal SALEEM who has been granted a long term tenancy agreement from the Landlord of the property, the Reading Minster of St Mary the Virgin.

‘The Hut’ is a small kiosk that is located in the central reservation in St Mary’s Butts opposite the Church.

The Hut currently has a Premises Licence number LP9000107 that authorises the provision of Late Night Refreshment off the premises only. The Premises Licence holder being a Mr Murat EMEKDAR, who had a tenancy agreement granted by the Church authority for the past twenty years or so, that was rescinded in the year 2018. Mr EMEKDAR ceased trading in that year and has vacated the property but has chosen not to surrender the existing Premises Licence and for his own reasons, has refused to transfer the licence to anyone else. I understand that each year, Mr EMEKDAR has paid the annual fee when due. Of course, he can in law, refuse to transfer the licence, as it is his possession. This creates the situation that he has the Premises Licence for The Hut, but has no longer a legal right to operate a business from that address.

Enquiries have been made with the Licensing department as to whether the Premises Licence may be revoked as Mr EMEKDAR no longer has the right of occupancy and therefore cannot trade. The Licensing Officer has confirmed that there is not a provision for revocation under the Licensing Act 2003 in such circumstances. I understand that the existing Premises Licence has not been subject to any review hearings or performance reviews during Mr EMEKDAR’s ownership.

It is possible however, to apply for the Grant of a new Premises Licence. Mr SALEEM is now making this application for the grant of a new Premises Licence for the property. This application simply requests that authorisation for the provision of Late Night Refreshment for exactly the same hours as the existing licence.

The principle of a second licence for a premises is based on a High Court ruling and I cite Poppleston and Allen:

‘The term “shadow licence” describes the situation where a premises licence is granted to one party in respect of a premises where another party already holds a separate licence. Although they are not explicitly referred to in the Licensing Act 2003, the concept of shadow licences was approved under the modern licensing regime in a 2013 High Court case between Extreme Oyster & Star Oyster Ltd. v Guildford Borough Council.’

It is recognised that the premises now fall within the Reading Borough Council's Cumulative Impact Policy area and therefore this application has addressed this matter by adding on new conditions within the operating schedule in respect of the four licensing objectives that should address any concerns that the responsible authorities may have.

Following a discussion with the Licensing Officer from Thames Valley Police concern was expressed that should a new licence be granted, if there were to be an issue as to how the business was being operated, which Premises Licence would be taken to task. We say, that should a licence be granted, it is this new licence that will be relevant. The Premises Licence held by Mr EMEKDAR will in effect, be made redundant.

It is recognised that this is an unusual circumstance, however, we would ask that common sense prevail in order that the Landlords and Tenant can go about their business with the benefit of a premises licence.

The Cumulative Impact Policy was designed to test the robustness of applications for the grant of new premises licence with a presumption of rebuttal for vertical drinking establishments, but not to prevent inward investment to the town centre.

There has been similar scenario's in Reading where the Licensing Committee have rightly, re-instated Premises Licences where they have been lost either through surrender, or insolvency of the holding companies, the Po Na Na, Bridge Street and the Sahara Bar in Gun Street.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

1. The premises licence holder shall ensure the premises' digitally recorded CCTV system cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. The entire licensable area shall be covered by the CCTV. Data recordings shall be made immediately available to an authorised Officer of Reading Borough Council or Thames Valley Police together with facilities for viewing upon request, subject to the provisions of the Data Protection Act. Recorded images shall be of such quality as to be able to identify the recorded person in any light. At least one member of staff on the premises at any time during operating hours shall be trained to access and download material from the CCTV system.
 2. Signage advising customers that CCTV is in use shall be positioned in prominent positions;
 3. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a door supervisor is employed on Friday and Saturday evenings from 23:45 hours through to close of business the following day.
 4. The Premises Licence Holder shall conduct a written risk assessment whenever late night refreshment is taking place at the premises between Sunday to Thursday inclusive to establish if door staff are required. The risk assessment shall be produced to an authorised Officer of Reading Borough Council or Thames Valley Police upon request.
 5. When employed, a register of Door Supervisors shall be kept. The register must show the following details:
 - Full SIA registration number.

 - Date and time that the Door Supervisor finished work, countersigned by the Duty Manager.

- The Door Supervisor register shall be kept at the premises and be available for inspection by an authorised Officer from Reading Borough Council or Thames Valley Police upon request, and shall be retained for a period of twelve months.

6. All door supervisors whilst employed at the premises shall wear hi visibility jackets/ tabards in bright green, yellow or orange in order that they can be clearly visible and identifiable at all times to the public and via CCTV both internally and externally. When tabards are worn, hi visibility armbands must also be worn that incorporate displaying SIA badges. If hi visibility full sleeved jackets are worn the PLH must ensure that all door supervisors badges are also displayed via an easily visible arm band of a different hi visibility colour to the jacket that is being worn worn
7. Whilst Door Supervisors are employed at the premises a minimum of one Door Supervisor working on the entrance/ exit to the premises, and one internally within the premises will be deployed with digitally recording Body Worn Video (BWV). The BWV will be used to record any incidents which occur inside or outside of the premises involving customers, prospective customers or any staff member that impact on any of the four licensing objectives.
8. Data recordings shall be made within forty-eight hours on request on to a USB stick subject to data protection guidelines available to an authorised officer of Thames Valley Police or Reading Borough Council together with facilities for immediate viewing upon request, subject to the provisions of the Data Protection Act.
9. The premises licence holder or nominated representative shall keep and maintain all right to work documents for all staff members. Right to work documents shall be kept at the premises and produced to an authorised Officer of Reading Borough Council or Thames Valley Police upon request.
10. The premises licence holder shall participate, as far as is practicable, in the Local Townsafe Radio Scheme when the premises are open for licensable activities.
11. All incidents which impact on any of the four licensing objectives shall be recorded in a register kept at the premises for this purpose. The names of the person recording the incident and those members of staff who deal with any incident shall also be recorded. Where known, any offenders name shall also be recorded.
 - (a) This record shall be available for inspection by a Police Officer or an authorised officer of Reading Borough Council upon request and shall be retained for one year. The record shall be signed off by the Designated Premises Supervisor or nominated representative at the end of each trading session.
 - (b) A weekly review of the incident register shall also be carried out by the Designated Premises Supervisor.

c) Public safety

1) The venue management shall have suitable risk assessments in place relating to slips, trips and falls.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- 1) A sign shall be displayed by the front door exit requesting patrons to leave quietly.
- 2) At the end of each trading session the staff shall conduct a litter patrol in the immediate area to collect and to safely dispose of cartons and containers.

e) The protection of children from harm

- 1) Staff shall be trained on the procedures for conflict management and that training shall be recorded on the staff training records.

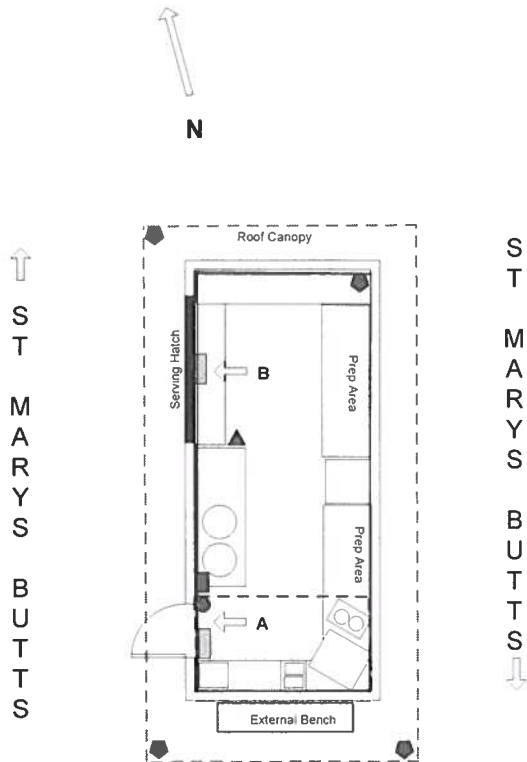

I C2107 Declan Smyth on behalf of the Chief Officer of Thames Valley Police wish to formally object to the proposed application for a premises licence submitted in relation to The Hut Central Kebabs, 39 St Mary's Butts, Reading, Berkshire, RG1 2LG by Mr Kamal Ahmed SALEEM.

Reading Borough Council Licensing Policy Statement includes detail of its Cumulative Impact policy which exists in order to address the cumulative stress that is caused by the high concentration of late night licensed premises within the defined area of Reading Town Centre.

This cumulative impact has been determined within the policy to have a negative impact on crime and disorder within the town due to the sheer volume and concentration of licensed premises which has a negative impact on the four licensing objectives.

Thames Valley Police object to this application as we believe that the Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP) has not been fully addressed by the applicant. It is felt that if this

application is granted it will likely lead to the licensing objectives being undermined, with specific regard to the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance. All four licensing objectives are of equal importance.

The Council Licensing Policy Statement states:-

Late Night Refreshment (takeaways) and Conditions – General Approach

6.19 Late night food outlets are a major contributor to crime and disorder and anti social behaviour within Reading. **Applicants who wish to provide hot food or drink after 2300hrs and up to 0500hrs, will need to demonstrate that their proposed operation will not exacerbate issues of crime and disorder in that locality.**

6.20 Applicants for late night refreshment are expected to take cognisance of the Secretary of State's Guidance and to include appropriate and proportionate measures within their operating schedule to assist in actively promoting the licensing objectives.

6.21 The licensing authority will expect all applicants who wish to provide late night refreshment to include measures for adequate staff training; measures to ensure that no public nuisance occurs from the premises as well as additional measures to assist in crime prevention such as CCTV and door supervisors.

6.22 Public nuisance can often occur from takeaways being sited in residential areas. This could be in relation to the use of delivery vehicles and the congregating of customers outside the premises. Applicants are expected to make an assessment of their proposed locality and implement measures to avoid disturbing local residents such as the use of electric bikes and the implementation of a dispersal policy.

6.23 Where it is practical, the authority will also look to ensure that all packaging used for the provision of hot food and drink shall be made of recyclable materials or be biodegradable. This will include all fixed premises and static vans.

The Secretary of States Guidance issued under Section 182 Licensing Act 2003 states:

"8.43 Applicants are expected to include positive proposals in their application on how they will manage any potential risks. Where specific policies apply in the area (for example, a cumulative impact policy), applicants are also expected to demonstrate an understanding of how the policy impacts on their application; any measures they will take to mitigate the impact; and why they consider the application should be an exception to the policy."

In either circumstance it would be expected that the applicant would address the CIP directly within their application to deal with this presumption of rebuttle.

However, this is not the case within this application and at no stage is the CIP directly referred to apart from the applicant offering of conditions, and stating that this would address any concerns that the responsible authorities may have. The conditions offered in the operating schedules are not comprehensive enough for the hours applied for and Thames Valley Police do not consider that any type or number

of conditions will be appropriate to mitigate the potential undermining of the licensing objectives.

As a **new premises application** the Sub-Committee may consider that if the applicant fails to rebut the presumption of refusal based on its application alone that no further evidence is required to be provided in relation to supporting a decision to refuse this application. Thames Valley Police would fully support that decision and feel that this application in itself fails to both consider and address the policy and therefore is likely to lead to an increase in crime and disorder.

The application states that it is for a “shadow licence” of an existing premises licence currently held by an individual that no longer has access to the premises. It is also suggested that the outgoing individual is refusing to transferred or sell the current licence on. The application then makes reference to the high court case of *Extreme Oyster & Star Oyster Ltd. v Guildford Borough Council* which provides legal weighting to the matter of shadow licences. However, this case highlights a ‘shadow licence’ being applied for by a **landlord** to protect their interests in any future business. The applicant is not the landlord of this property that this licence is being applied for, therefore the above case is not relevant in this premises licence application other than providing that shadow licences may be permissible.

On the 1st December 2019 (Niche No. 43190374839) as of the writing of this representation there has been a stabbing and a number of major instances of disorder in the immediate vicinity/ area of the proposed licence. We are supplying for further consideration a full list of URN’s relating to this specific area which date back to 1st December 2018 and may provide evidence which the Sub-Committee feel of assistance in relation to the types of incident that Thames Valley Police have recorded as calls for service from the St Mary’s Butts area. **(SEE APPENDIX TVP-DS1A, TVP-DS1B & TVP-DS1C)**. This report provides basic information in relation to the amount of incidents that have been reported, as well as some indication as to the type of incidents that have been notified to us as occurring in this specific area historically.

The incidents have not been interrogated or changed or updated and we ask that you place as much or as little weight on the evidence contained within these reports as you see fit. **(SEE APPENDIX TVP-DS1)**

In summary Thames Valley Police believe that this application does not rebut the presumption against the issuance of this licence and believe strongly that no evidence has been provided within the application to provide assurances that may lead the licensing sub-committee to rule in favour of this application.

We feel strongly that this must be decided upon as a new application and as such the Cumulative Impact Policy has not been addressed..

We therefore respectfully ask the Licensing Sub-Committee to refuse this application.

Thames Valley Police ask the Licensing Sub-Committee to please have due regard to the following paragraphs from within the Council Statement of Licensing Policy

which have not been included within the body of this representation, but which we feel are pertinent in this situation:-

12.2 Cumulative Impact for the purposes of this policy means the potential impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives of a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area. For example, this may include the potential impact on crime and disorder or public nuisance on an area that a large concentration of licensed premises may have.

12.10 This assessment will apply to all applications for the grant or variation of a premises licence or club premises certificate and all premises that may benefit from a premises licence or club premises certificate. This includes material variations for increased hours for licensable activity; increased capacity and any other matter that may add to cumulative impact in the Town Centre Cumulative Impact Area. Section 5A of the Licensing Act 2003 uses the phrase 'to grant any further relevant authorisations' in relation to Cumulative Impact Assessments. The Authority interprets that to mean all grant and variation applications in the relevant area. A material variation to increase the scope of a licence – whether that be for extended licensable activities; extended hours or an increase of capacity – is, by all definition, a grant of a new relevant authorisation in the area as it replaces the currently existing one. This is consistent with the Secretary of State's Guidance and the explanatory notes to the Policing and Crime Act 2017 which was the legislation that inserted Cumulative Impact Assessments into the Licensing Act 2003. The Home Office have also confirmed that this is the intent of the legislation.

12.11 The Authority has considered in formulating this assessment - in close consultation with Thames Valley Police - that significant concerns do exist over the high concentration of licensed premises within the town centre area. The high concentration of licensed premises is already causing a negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. Therefore granting further licences or certificates or variations to licences and certificates may be inconsistent with the Authority's duty to promote the licensing objectives and protect the public as a whole.

12.12 Concerns do exist about the concentration of premises in parts of the town centre, particularly in Friar Street, Gun Street, St Mary's Butts and adjoining roads, together with the impact these premises are having upon the licensing objectives. These concerns and the associated impact on the crime and disorder licensing objective are underpinned by the evidence in this assessment.

12.13 The effect of the Cumulative Impact Assessment is to create a presumption that applications for the grant of a premises licence or club premises certificate or material variations within the stated area will be refused if relevant representations are received. This is because of the high concentration of licensed premises already in existence in the town centre and the further undermining of the licensing objectives that is likely to occur if further licences are granted.

*12.31 **Late Night Refreshment Outlets (takeaways):** All applications for late night food establishments are likely to attract representations unless the applicant can demonstrate that there are exceptional reasons to grant such a licence. Late night*

food outlets are a major contributor to crime and disorder within the late night economy, therefore the general policy is to refuse such applications.

Late night food outlets will need to demonstrate within their operating schedule detailed and robust measures to mitigate issues of crime and disorder associated with operating within the night time economy. It is not acceptable or conducive to the promotion of the licensing objectives for late night food outlets to simply operate to the minimum of standards. Any applicant will be expected to operate to the highest of standards which actively promote the licensing objectives and the provisions outlined in the Council's licensing policy.

Late night food outlets that sell alcohol will also be expected to demonstrate how they will responsibly retail alcohol on and off the premises. If it cannot be demonstrated that any alcohol will be sold responsibly and in accordance to the provisions in this policy, then that also will likely attract representations.

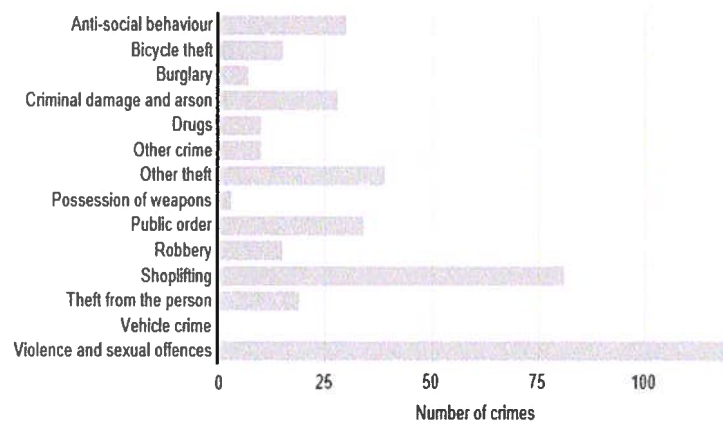

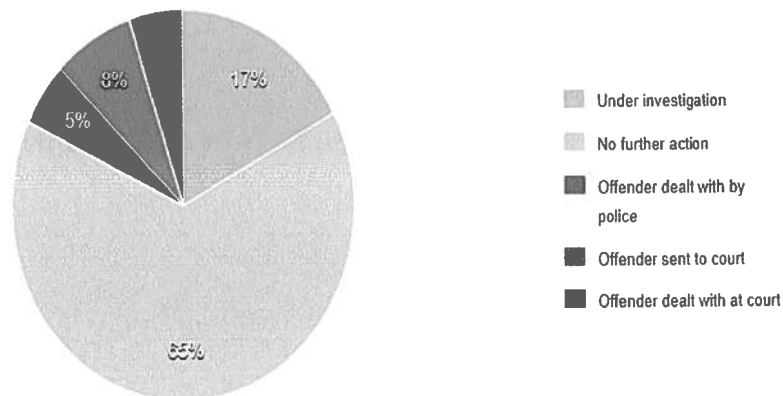

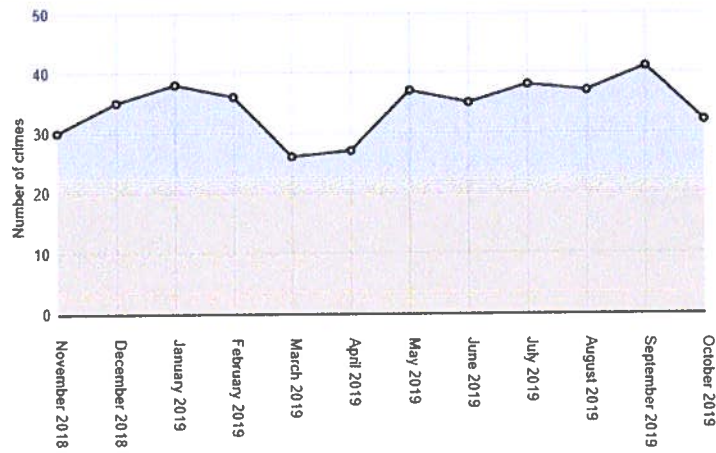

| <p>This premises currently has a licence with number LP9000107. The holder of this licence has vacated the property and has decided not to transfer or surrender the licence. The premises requires a premises licence for Late Night Refreshment to operate as a takeaway from 23.00 hours to the terminal hours stated above. These hours in this location have the potential to undermine the Licensing objectives of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety. The licensing team wish to make representation against the application submitted on behalf of Mr Kamal Ahmed Saleem to licence the premises known as The Hut Central Kebabs, 39 St Marys Butts, Reading , RG1 2LG for the following reasons:</p> | | | | | | | |
| <p>1. The application is contrary to the Council's Cumulative Impact Assessment as prescribed in the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. The policy at 12.12 specifically mentions St Mary's Butts as a source of concern due to the numbers of existing licensed premises. Appendix RS-1 exhibits Appendix 4 of this policy which illustrates the consistently high levels of violent and sexual offences that occur in the St Mary's Butts area of town.</p> | | | | | | | |

Appendix RS-2 provides the most up-to-date crime statistics for St Mary's Butts and it clearly shows that not only are there high numbers of crime in the area, but also that the number of crimes between midnight and 0400hrs are consistently higher than at any other time of the day. In the past few weeks as of the writing of this representation there has been a stabbing and a number of instances of disorder in the immediate vicinity of the proposed licence.

2. The application states that it is for a shadow licence of an existing licence currently held by an individual that no longer has access to the site but has to date not transferred or surrendered the current licence. The application then makes reference to the high court case of *Extreme Oyster & Star Oyster Ltd. v Guildford Borough Council* which provides legal weighting to the matter of shadow licences. However, this case highlights a 'shadow licence' being applied for by a landlord to protect their interests in any future business at their property. In the above case the claimant stated their intentions in respect of the future of its business at the premises were:

" i) To protect it in the event that its tenants went into liquidation or surrendered its licence, or was the subject of review proceedings.

ii) To protect it in the event that its tenants failed to pay / were late paying their rent.

iii) In the event that it gave notice to quit and retake possession pending redevelopment of the premises, to enable it to run the premises in the meantime.

iv) To enable it to market the premises or parts of the premises should the tenants stay in possession for the full term of the tenancy that had a one - year 'break' clause."

Mr Saleem is not the landlord of the property that this licence is being applied for, therefore the above case is not relevant in this application other than providing that shadow licences may be permissible.

Paragraphs 9.23 and 9.24 of Reading Borough Council's Statement of Licensing Policy provide an explanation of the meaning of the term 'shadow licence' and details the Authority's stance on the matter. Specifically, 9.24 states *'Any application for a 'shadow licence' and any enforcement action that may need to be taken will be dealt with in accordance with this policy and the measures already set out. This would include, for example, a prospective applicant for a 'shadow licence' in the Council's Cumulative Impact Area being able to rebut the presumption of refusal against such licences being granted in that area.'*

It is the opinion of the Licensing Authority that an application for a shadow licence does not provide any inherent evidence in terms of rebutting the Authority's Cumulative Impact Assessment. The original licence that this application is proposing to shadow was granted before the Cumulative Impact Assessment formed part of the Authority's Licensing Policy and therefore this application can't be considered on the same grounds as the

original application. We appreciate that the current licence, if transferred, could be used as per the hours stated on it and it is our interpretation of this application that this is the main point being put forward to rebut the Cumulative Impact Assessment, in that granting a shadow licence will not provide any more negative impact on the area, as it is, in all practicality, simply replacing a current licence. However, despite cognisance of this point, the matter of the fact is that the current licence, in all practicality, is no longer active and therefore not causing any negative impact. Since this licence has been dormant the levels of crime have remained very high in this area and the likely effect of granting this licence will only compound this issue.

3. When looking to grant a premises licence, the licensing authority and other Responsible Authorities have to determine what the likely effect of granting any licence would be on the promotion of the licensing objectives. This is consistent with section 18 (6) of the Licensing Act 2003. The licensing objectives are prospective as outlined below and given all of the above reasons we respectfully submit that this application be refused.

The approach of the Licensing Team:

The Responsible Authorities named in the Licensing Act 2003 have to ensure that the licensing objectives are all actively promoted to prevent crime and disorder and public nuisance. All four licensing objectives are of equal importance.

Case Law and Secretary of State's Guidance (April 2018)

Section 1.5 of the Secretary of State's Guidance states that the Licensing Act 2003 also supports a number of other key aims and purposes. These are vitally important and should be the principal aims of everyone involved in licensing work: They include protecting the public and local residents from crime, anti-social behaviour and noise nuisance.

Section 18 (6) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that representations should be about the likely effect of the grant of a licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Therefore as outlined in the Court of Appeal Licensing case *Hope and Glory v City of Westminster* (2011) EWCA Civ31 - *licensing decisionsinvolve an evaluation of what is to be regarded as reasonably acceptable in a particular location...(this) is essentially a matter of judgement rather than a matter of pure fact*'.

Further, in the High Court case of *East Lindsey District Council v Abu Hanif* (2016) EWHC 1265 (admin) Mr Justice Jay reaffirmed the position that Licensing authorities need not wait for the licensing objectives to be undermined before it takes action on a licensing application. Mr Justice Jay stated that '*the prevention of crime and disorder requires a prospective*

consideration of what is warranted within the public interest having regard to the twin considerations of prevention and deterrence'.

Lastly, the case of the British Beer and Pub Association v Canterbury City Council clearly indicates the use of the Council's policy in guiding applicants when applying for a licence. Mr Justice Richards stated that:

"The council is entitled to indicate in the policy its own expectations with regard to the promotion of the licensing objectives; and I do not think that an applicant can legitimately complain if a failure to take account of those expectations gives rise to representations...An applicant who does not tailor his application to the policy therefore faces an uphill struggle."

The Secretary of State's Guidance (latest edition of April 2018) at paragraphs 8.41 to 8.49 specifically outline what an applicant should address in order to be able to demonstrate that the proposed use of the premises for licensable activities would not undermine the licensing objectives.

8.41 In completing an operating schedule, applicants are expected to have regard to the statement of licensing policy for their area. They must also be aware of the expectations of the licensing authority and the responsible authorities as to the steps that are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and to demonstrate knowledge of their local area when describing the steps they propose to take to promote the licensing objectives. Licensing authorities and responsible authorities are expected to publish information about what is meant by the promotion of the licensing objectives and to ensure that applicants can readily access advice about these matters. However, applicants are also expected to undertake their own enquiries about the area in which the premises are situated to inform the content of the application.

8.42 Applicants are, in particular, expected to obtain sufficient information to enable them to demonstrate, when setting out the steps they propose to take to promote the licensing objectives, that they understand:

- the layout of the local area and physical environment including crime and disorder hotspots, proximity to residential premises and proximity to areas where children may congregate;
- any risk posed to the local area by the applicants' proposed licensable activities; and
- any local initiatives (for example, local crime reduction initiatives or voluntary schemes including local taxi-marshalling schemes, street pastors and other schemes) which may help to mitigate potential risks.

8.43 Applicants are expected to include positive proposals in their application on how they will manage any potential risks. Where specific policies apply in the area (for example, a cumulative impact policy), applicants are also expected to demonstrate an understanding of how the

policy impacts on their application; any measures they will take to mitigate the impact; and why they consider the application should be an exception to the policy.

8.44 It is expected that enquiries about the locality will assist applicants when determining the steps that are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. For example, premises with close proximity to residential premises should consider what effect this will have on their smoking, noise management and dispersal policies to ensure the promotion of the public nuisance objective. Applicants must consider all factors which may be relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives, and where there are no known concerns, acknowledge this in their application.

8.45 The majority of information which applicants will require should be available in the licensing policy statement in the area. Other publicly available sources which may be of use to applicants include:

- the Crime Mapping website;
- Neighbourhood Statistics websites;
- websites or publications by local responsible authorities;
- websites or publications by local voluntary schemes and initiatives; and
- on-line mapping tools.

8.46 While applicants are not required to seek the views of responsible authorities before formally submitting their application, they may find them to be a useful source of expert advice on local issues that should be taken into consideration when making an application. Licensing authorities may wish to encourage co-operation between applicants, responsible authorities and, where relevant, local residents and businesses before applications are submitted in order to minimise the scope for disputes to arise.

8.47 Applicants are expected to provide licensing authorities with sufficient information in this section to determine the extent to which their proposed steps are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives in the local area. **Applications must not be based on providing a set of standard conditions to promote the licensing objectives and applicants are expected to make it clear why the steps they are proposing are appropriate for the premises.**

8.48 All parties are expected to work together in partnership to ensure that the licensing objectives are promoted collectively. Where there are no disputes, the steps that applicants propose to take to promote the licensing objectives, as set out in the operating schedule, will very often translate directly into conditions that will be attached to premises licences with the minimum of fuss.

8.49 For some premises, it is possible that no measures will be appropriate to promote one or more of the licensing objectives, for example, because they are adequately covered by other existing legislation. It is however

important that all operating schedules should be precise and clear about the measures that are proposed to promote each of the licensing objectives

The Council's Licensing Policy:

When making an application, the applicant is supposed to have read and had regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing policy. The onus is on the applicant to demonstrate that their proposal promotes the licensing objectives and is compliant with the expectations laid out in the guidance and Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. The application, as submitted, is contrary to the following paragraphs:

6.19 Late night food outlets are a major contributor to crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour within Reading. Applicants who wish to provide hot food or drink after 2300hrs and up to 0500hrs, will need to demonstrate that their proposed operation will not exacerbate issues of crime and disorder in that locality.

6.20 Applicants for late night refreshment are expected to take cognisance of the Secretary of State's Guidance and to include appropriate and proportionate measures within their operating schedule to assist in actively promoting the licensing objectives.

6.21 The licensing authority will expect all applicants who wish to provide late night refreshment to include measures for adequate staff training; measures to ensure that no public nuisance occurs from the premises as well as additional measures to assist in crime prevention such as CCTV and door supervisors.

6.22 Public nuisance can often occur from takeaways being sited in residential areas. This could be in relation to the use of delivery vehicles and the congregating of customers outside the premises. Applicants are expected to make an assessment of their proposed locality and implement measures to avoid disturbing local residents such as the use of electric bikes and the implementation of a dispersal policy.

6.23 Where it is practical, the authority will also look to ensure that all packaging used for the provision of hot food and drink shall be made of recyclable materials or be biodegradable. This will include all fixed premises and static vans.

7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 gives the licensing authority the power to make decisions about the hours during which premises can conduct licensable activities as part of the implementation of this policy. The licensing authority will make appropriate decisions on licensing hours for the locality of each premises. All applications will be considered on its individual merits.

7.2 When an application receives representations, the authority may consider reducing the opening hours and times for licensable activities if it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7.3 As part of the operating schedule submitted with any application, the applicant is expected to take cognisance of the guidance, this policy and any other available data pertaining to their prospective locality and the potential impact their operation may have on that area.

7.4 Where it is deemed appropriate and proportionate to do so, the authority may seek to reduce the hours for licensable activities in order to promote an orderly and gradual dispersal from a certain area or certain premises.

7.16 There are concerns about noise, nuisance, crime and disorder and anti social behaviour in respect of premises open late and providing hot food and drink. Operators and potential applicants of late night refreshment venues wishing to open past 11pm will need to demonstrate that there are suitable policies and procedures in place to mitigate any undermining of the licensing objectives from their operation. If suitable practices and policies are not put in place and it is the belief of the Authority that crime and disorder and/or a public nuisance is likely to occur due to the late operation of late night refreshment premises, then the Authority will look at reducing the hours and or (subject to relevant representations being received) removing late night refreshment from an application in its entirety.

7.17 The Authority - whilst taking each application on its own merits - is unlikely to grant excessive hours to any premises if it believes it will undermine the promotion of the licensing objectives in the locality where it proposes to operate. Applicants should ensure that their application takes cognisance of the information available - including crime data - and ensure that the operating schedule is tailored accordingly. Premises within the Council's town centre Cumulative Impact Area will also need to ensure that they rebut the presumption of refusal against applications in that area.

Cumulative Impact: The approach of Reading Borough Council

The Cumulative Impact Policy and designated area were introduced due to a high concentration of licensed premises within the town centre and the impact these premises were having on the promotion of the Licensing objectives. The policy, stated in the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, details the rationale of this approach. It also creates a rebuttable assumption that applications for the grant or variation of a premises licence or club premises certificate within the Cumulative Impact Area will be refused or limited - if relevant representations are received - unless the applicant is able to demonstrate within their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. This is detailed within Sections 12.13 to 12.15 and is entirely consistent with the relevant paragraphs of Chapter 14 of the Secretary of State's Guidance to the Licensing Act 2003. 12.13 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy states that it will apply to all applications for premises licences and club premises certificates as well as material

variations within the Reading Central CIP Area. Material variations include increases in hours, increases in capacity (licensable area) and any other variation that are likely to add to the overall cumulative impact in the area.

One further point to make on Cumulative Impact is with reference to the stated case of R (on the application of Portsmouth City Council) v 3D Entertainment Group (CRC) Ltd [2011] EWHC 507 (Admin). The Learned Judge Supperstone within paragraph 11 of the judgement stated that Magistrates had erred in law by incorrectly applying Portsmouth's Cumulative Impact Policy in a way that required the Council and Police to abduce evidence that there would be a negative cumulative impact. He went on to state in paragraph 18 of the judgement that the burden was entirely on 3d Entertainment Group to persuade the Licensing Authority that the operating schedule was such that there would be no cumulative impact. In short therefore, the onus is on the applicant to rebut the Council's Cumulative Impact Policy if applying for a grant or variation within the cumulative impact area and this should primarily be done through the operating schedule of the submitted application form. The applicant in this matter has not rebutted the policy.

Cumulative Impact

As stated above, the Cumulative Impact policy was introduced in Reading town centre as a means to tackle the issues that arise from such a high concentration of licensed premises within such a small area. Because of the high levels of crime within the town centre and in an effort to prevent further stress being placed upon the town, applicants would have to demonstrate that they can rebut the presumption of refusing a grant or variation of a premises licence. If relevant representations are received and the applicant is unable to demonstrate that their proposed operation will promote the licensing objectives and cause a negative cumulative impact, then the application is likely to be refused. This is stated at paragraph at 12.15 of the Council's Cumulative Impact Assessment.

Late night food outlets:

12.31 All applications for late night food establishments are likely to attract representations unless the applicant can demonstrate that there are exceptional reasons to grant such a licence. Late night food outlets are a major contributor to crime and disorder within the late night economy, therefore the general policy is to refuse such applications.

Late night food outlets will need to demonstrate within their operating schedule detailed and robust measures to mitigate issues of crime and disorder associated with operating within the night time economy. It is not acceptable or conducive to the promotion of the licensing objectives for late night food outlets to simply operate to the minimum of standards. Any applicant will be expected to operate to the highest of standards which actively promote the licensing objectives and the provisions outlined in the

Council's licensing policy.

12.34 The above paragraphs (12.27 to 12.33) as well as the other statements in this assessment - particularly paragraphs 12.13 and 12.23 also apply to applications seeking to significantly increase capacity; applications that seek extended opening hours; applications for 'shadow licences' (see paragraph 9.23 and 9.24) and any other matter the Authority deems may undermine its ability to actively promote the licensing objectives.

The conditions offered in the operating schedules are not comprehensive enough for the hours applied for and we do not consider that any type or number of conditions will be appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

It is therefore not credible that the Cumulative Impact policy has been rebutted and that the likely effect of granting any licence would have a detrimental impact on the town as a whole.

I have stated previously why the licensing team believe the application should be refused. If the committee is satisfied that the measures contained within the application rebut the Cumulative Impact Assessment, are appropriate and proportionate to actively promote the licensing objectives and is satisfied that they will be implemented by the applicant, then we would respectfully ask for the terminal hour for licensable activities be reduced to 0000hrs every day and the following conditions be attached to any licence:

1. The premises licence holder shall ensure the premises' digitally recorded CCTV system cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. The entire licensable area shall be covered by the CCTV. Cameras shall be positioned in a way that the entire area surrounding the premises is recorded. Data recordings shall be made immediately available to an authorised officer of Thames Valley Police or Reading Borough Council together with facilities for viewing upon request. Recorded images shall be of such quality as to be able to identify the recorded person in any light. At least one member of staff on the premises at any time during operating hours shall be trained to access and download material from the CCTV system.

2. Signs shall be placed in prominent positions on the premises notifying customers that CCTV is in operation.

3. All incidents which impact on any of the four licensing objectives shall be recorded in a register kept at the premises for this purpose. The names of the person recording the incident and those members of staff who deal with any incident shall also be recorded. Where known, any offenders name shall also be recorded;

(a) this record shall be available for inspection by a Police Officer or an authorised officer of Reading Borough Council upon request and shall be retained for one year. The record shall be signed off by the nominated representative at the end of each trading session;

(b) a weekly review of the incident register shall also be carried out by the nominated representative.

4. The premises licence holder or nominated representative shall participate in the Local Town Radio Scheme when the premises are opened for licensable activities Monday to Sunday inclusive.

5. The premises licence holder or nominated representative shall keep and maintain all right to work documents for all staff members. Right to work documents shall be kept at the premises and produced to authorised officers of Reading Borough Council and Thames Valley Police upon request.

6. The immediate vicinity outside of the premises and in any external areas associated with the premises shall be kept clear of litter.

7. All takeaway packaging and utensils for use by customers shall be made of biodegradable or recyclable materials.

8. Clearly legible and suitable notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

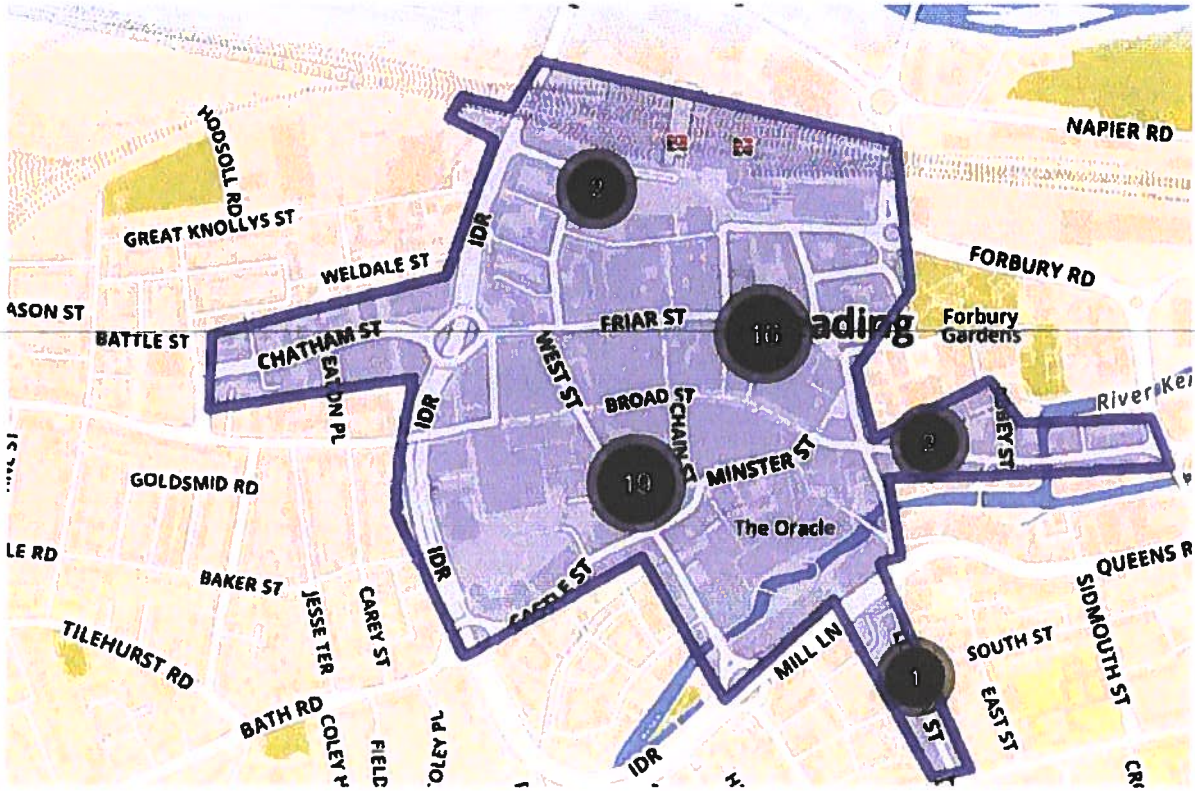

Any licensable activity that takes place at the premises not in accordance with a licence is an offence under Section 136 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003.

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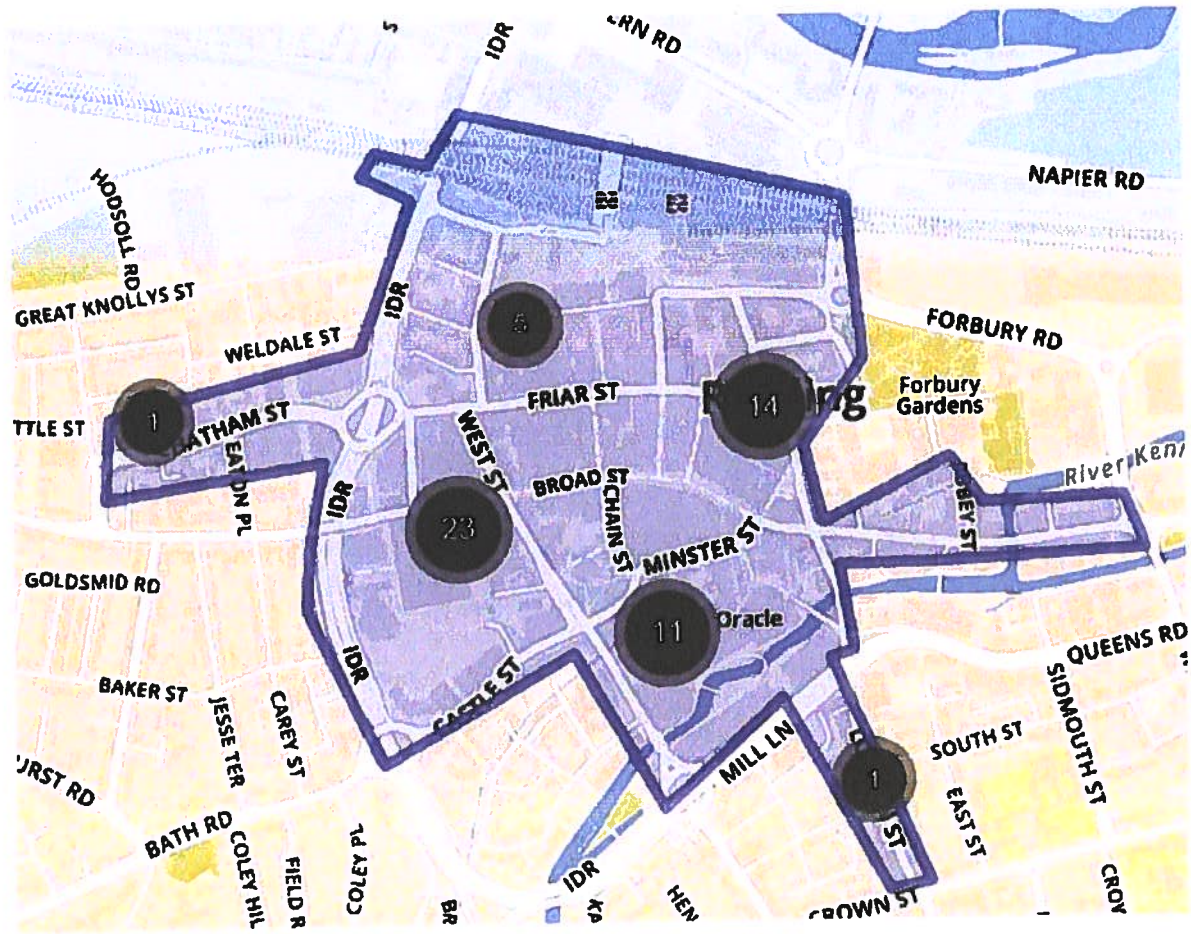
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Violence and Sexual Offences within the Town Centre Cumulative
Impact Area - January 2017 to March 2018

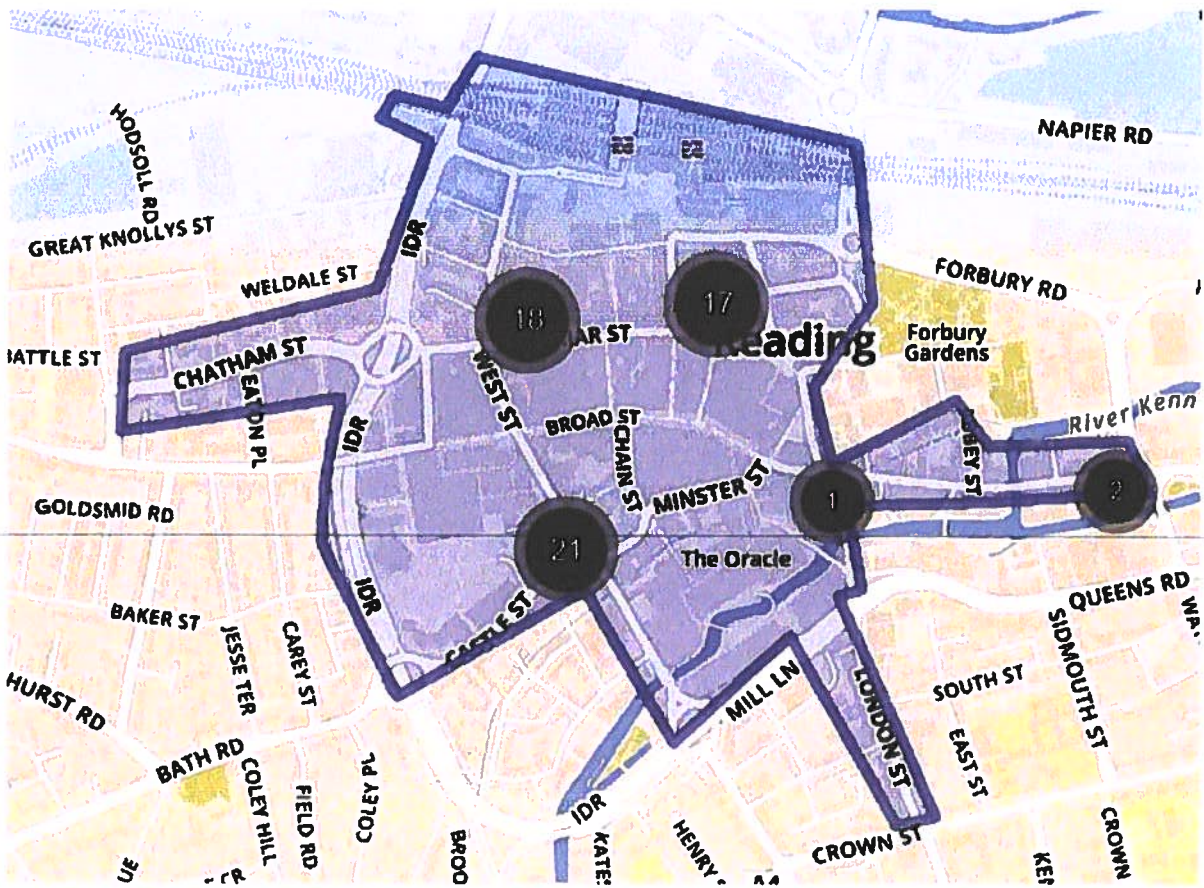
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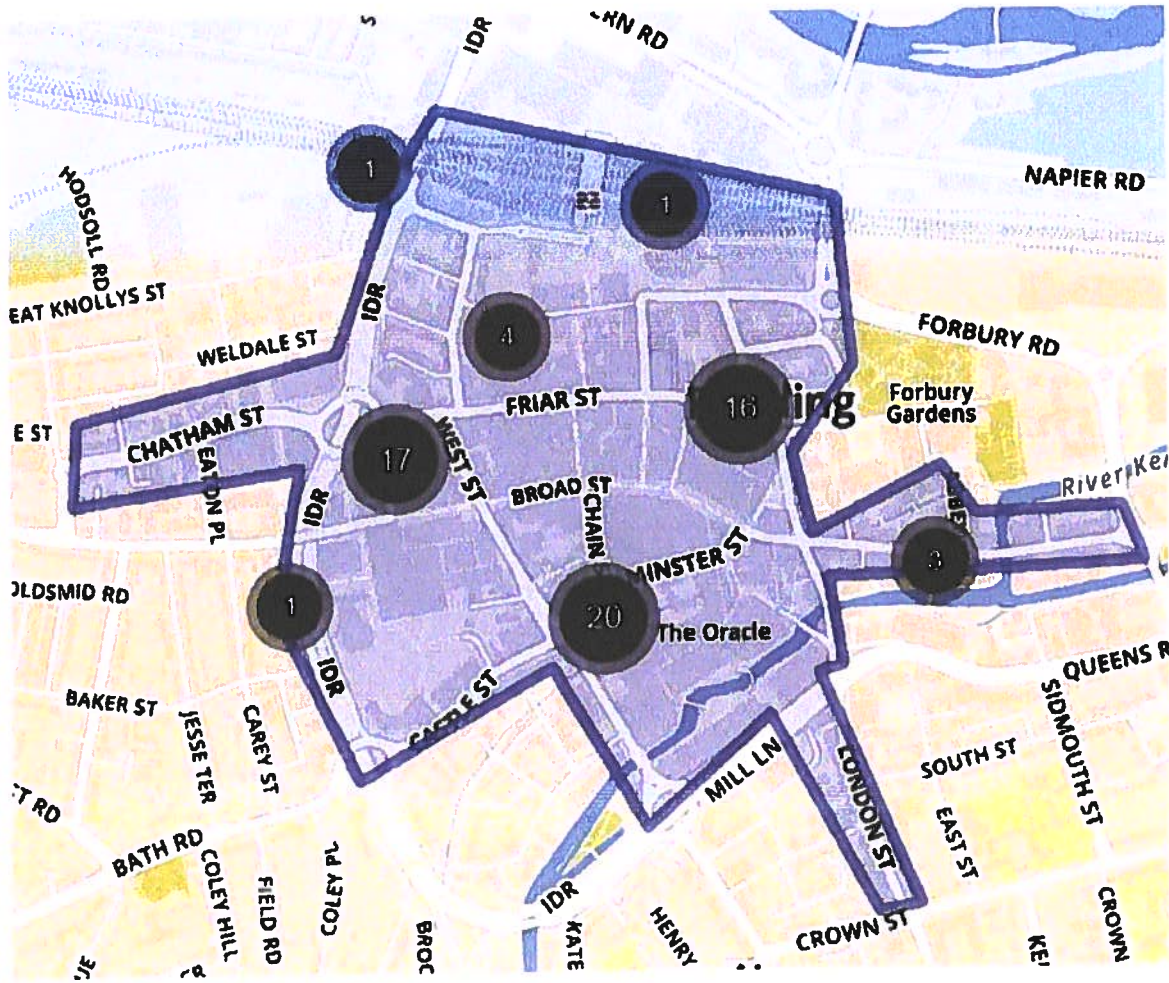
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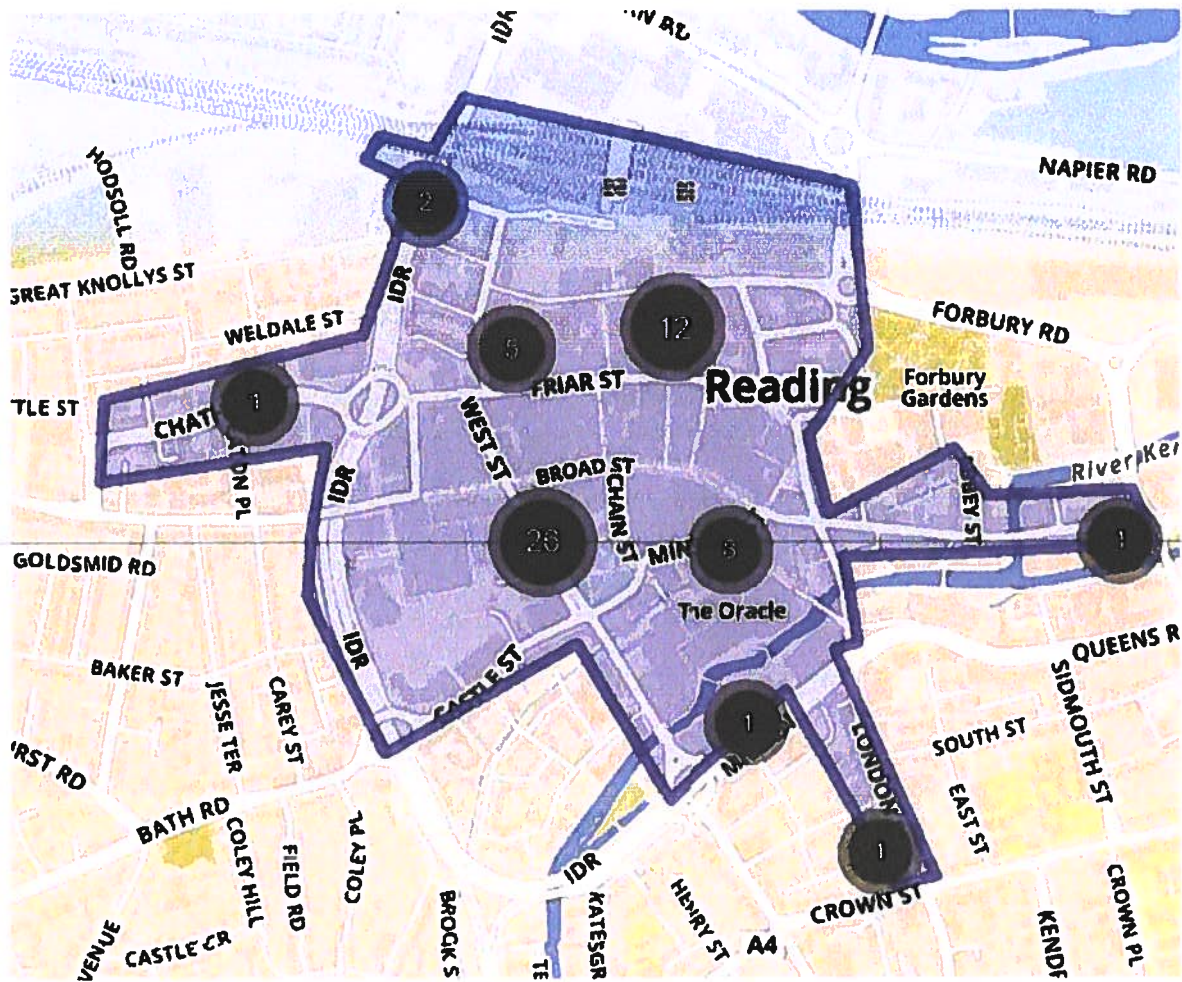
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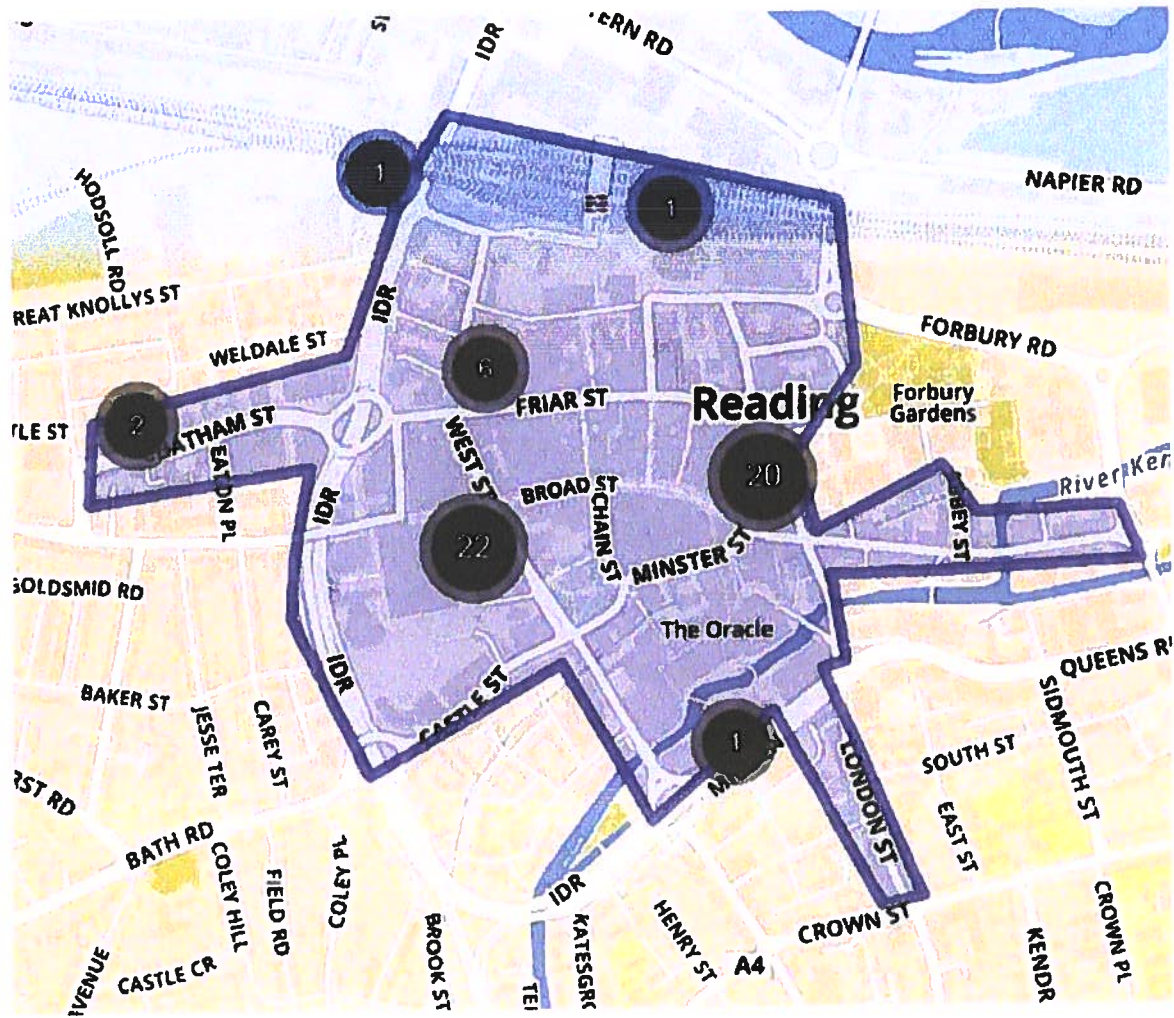
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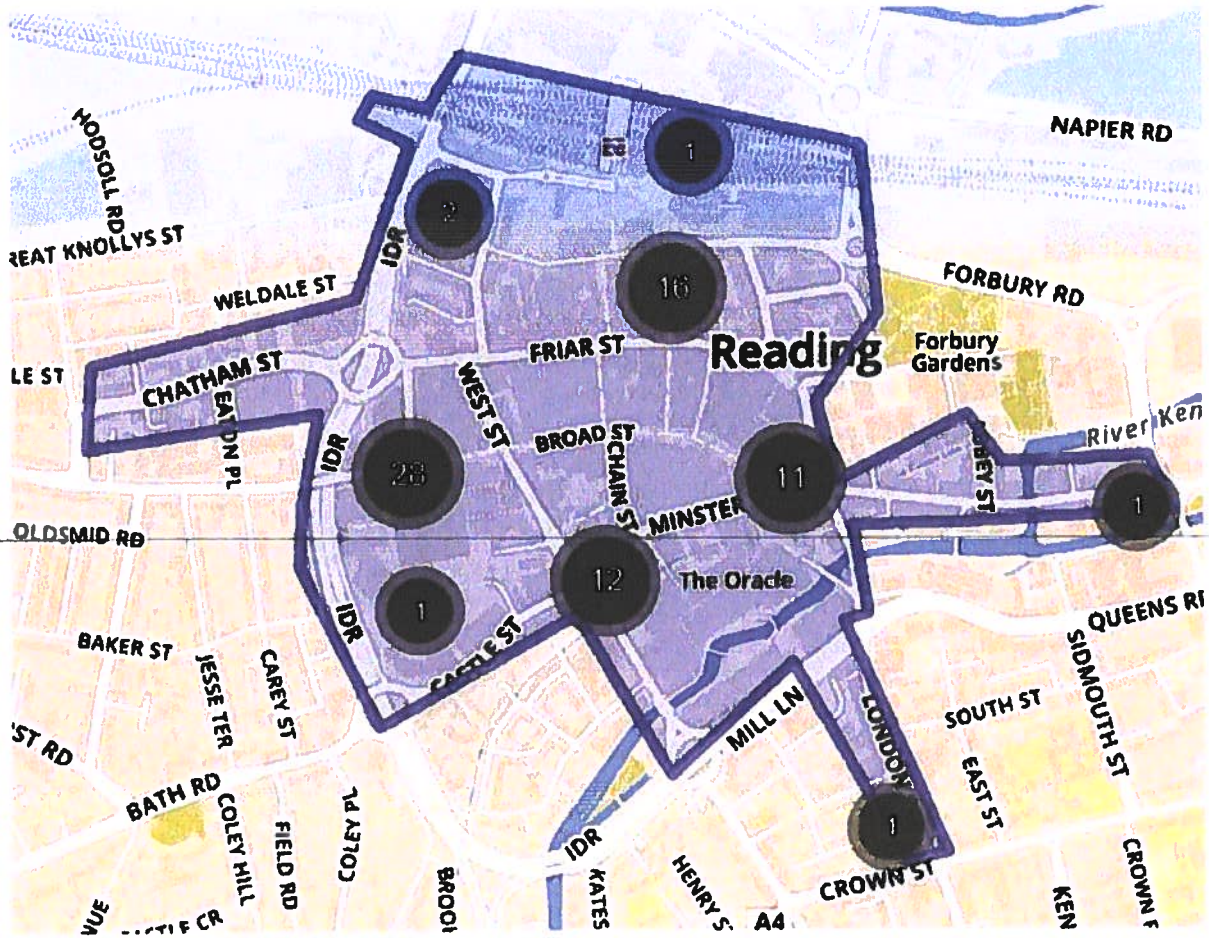
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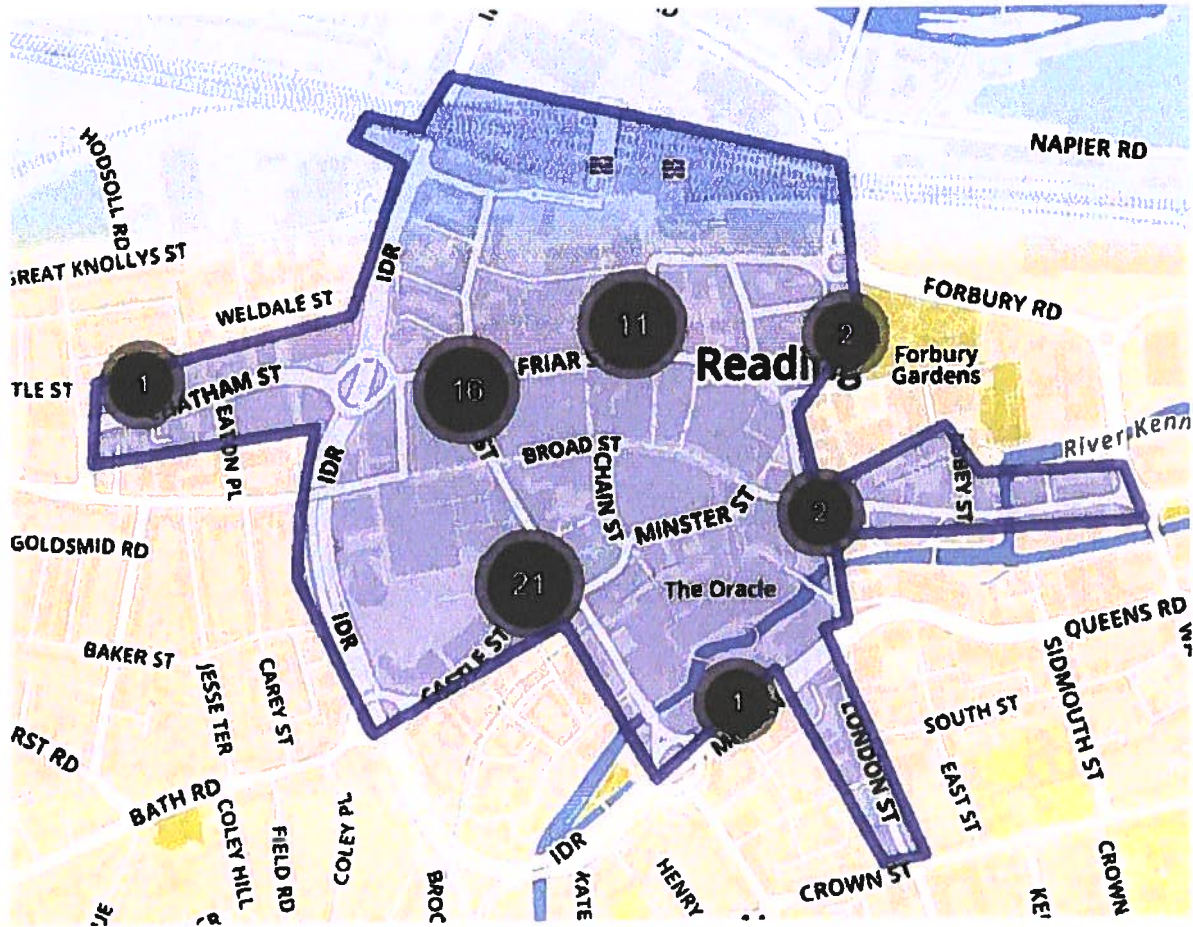
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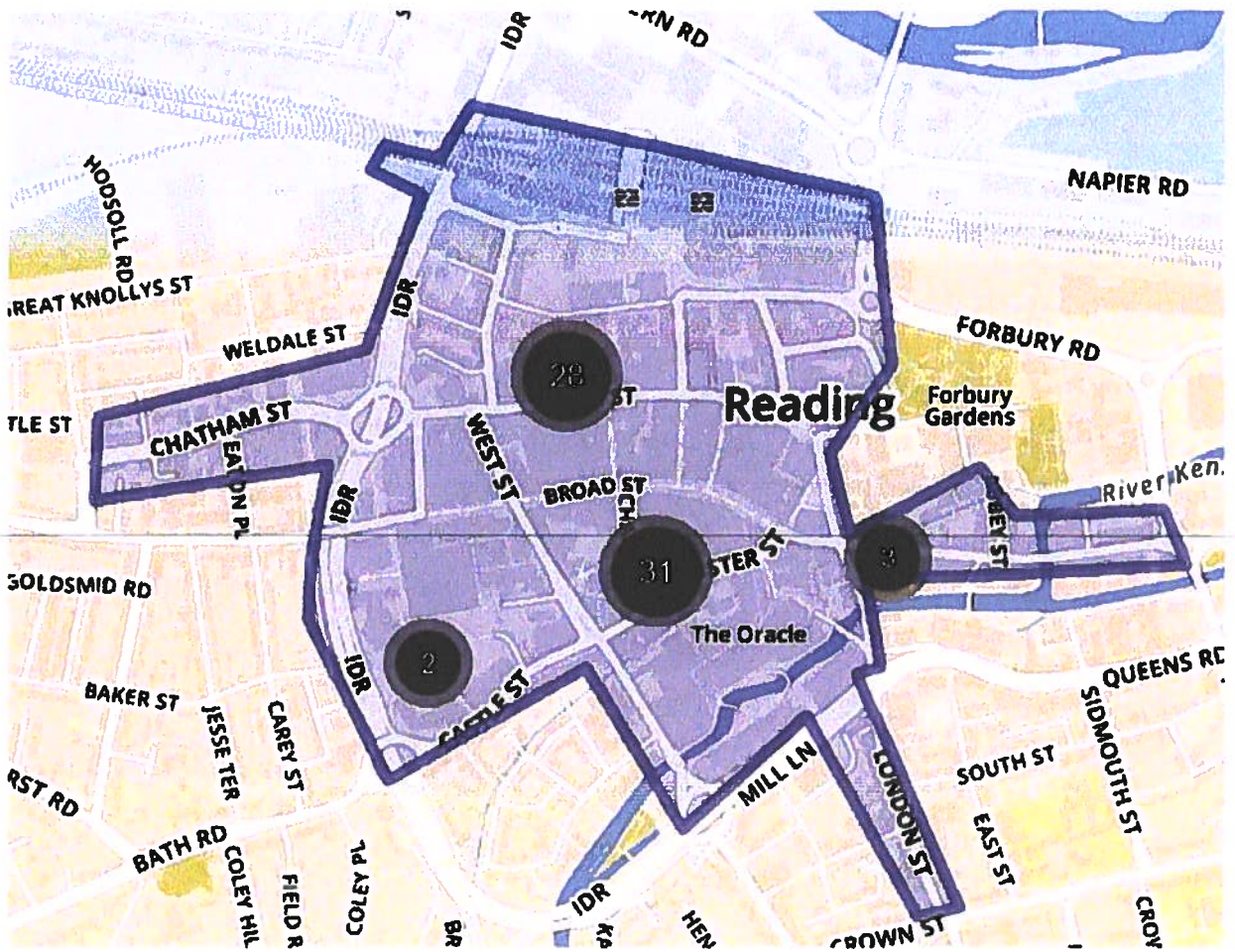
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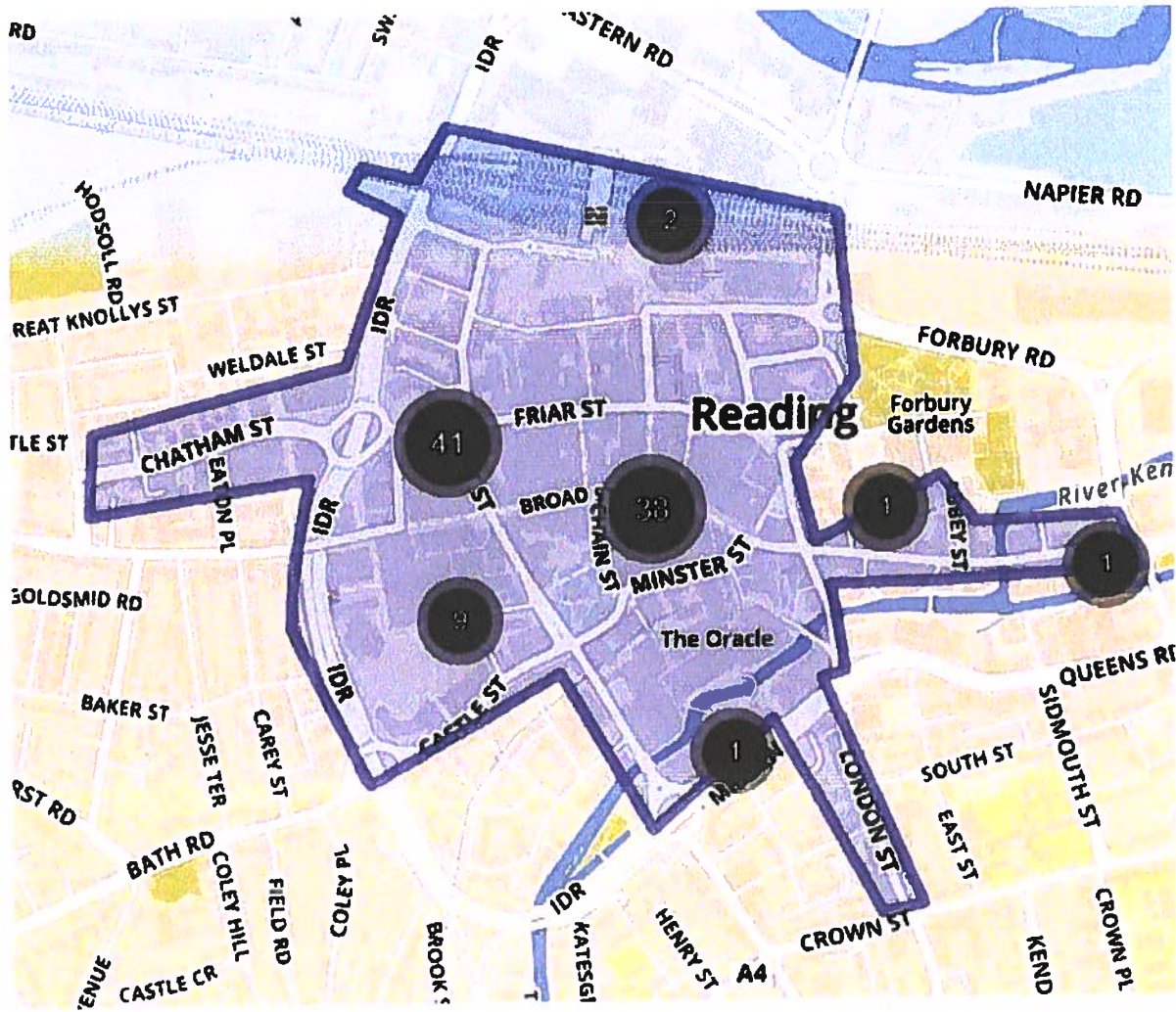
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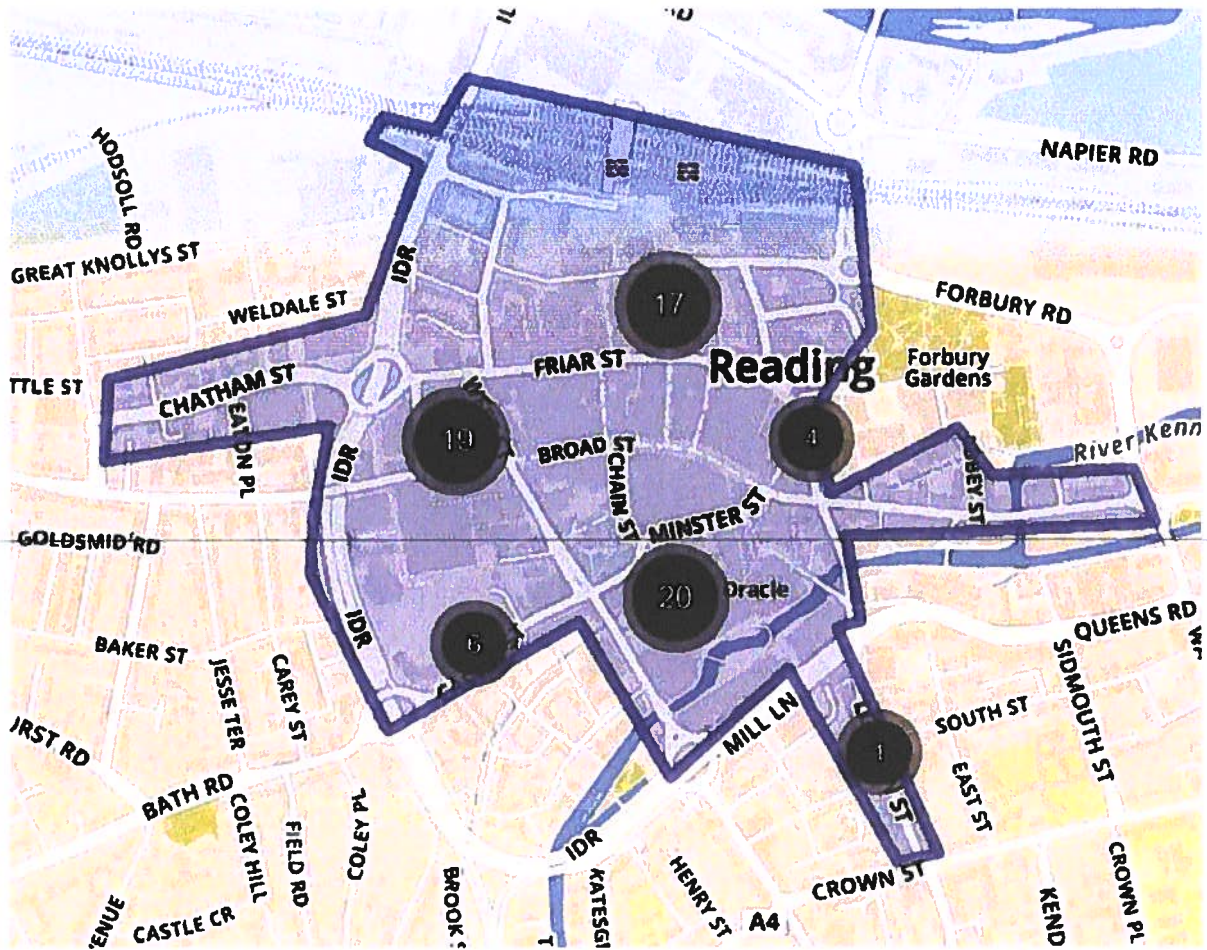
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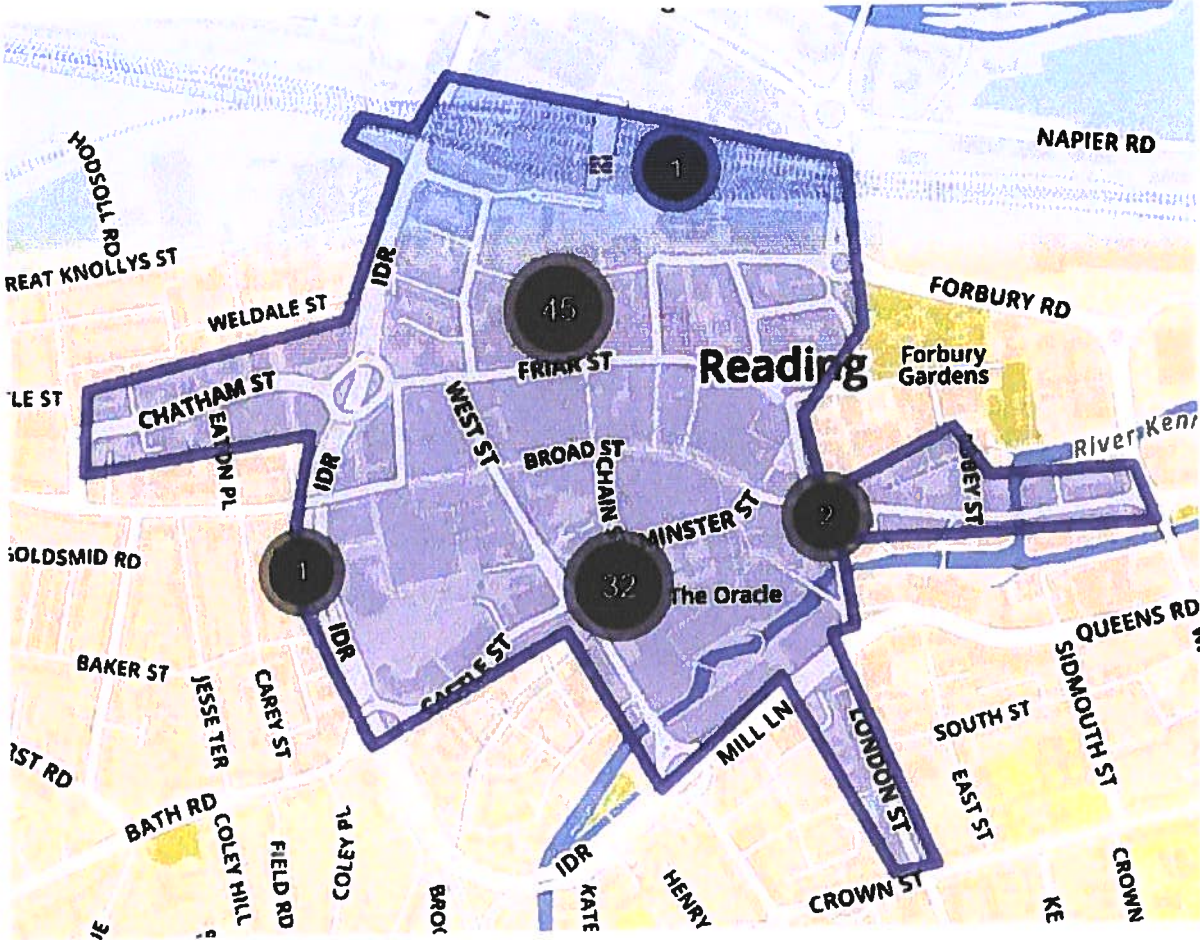
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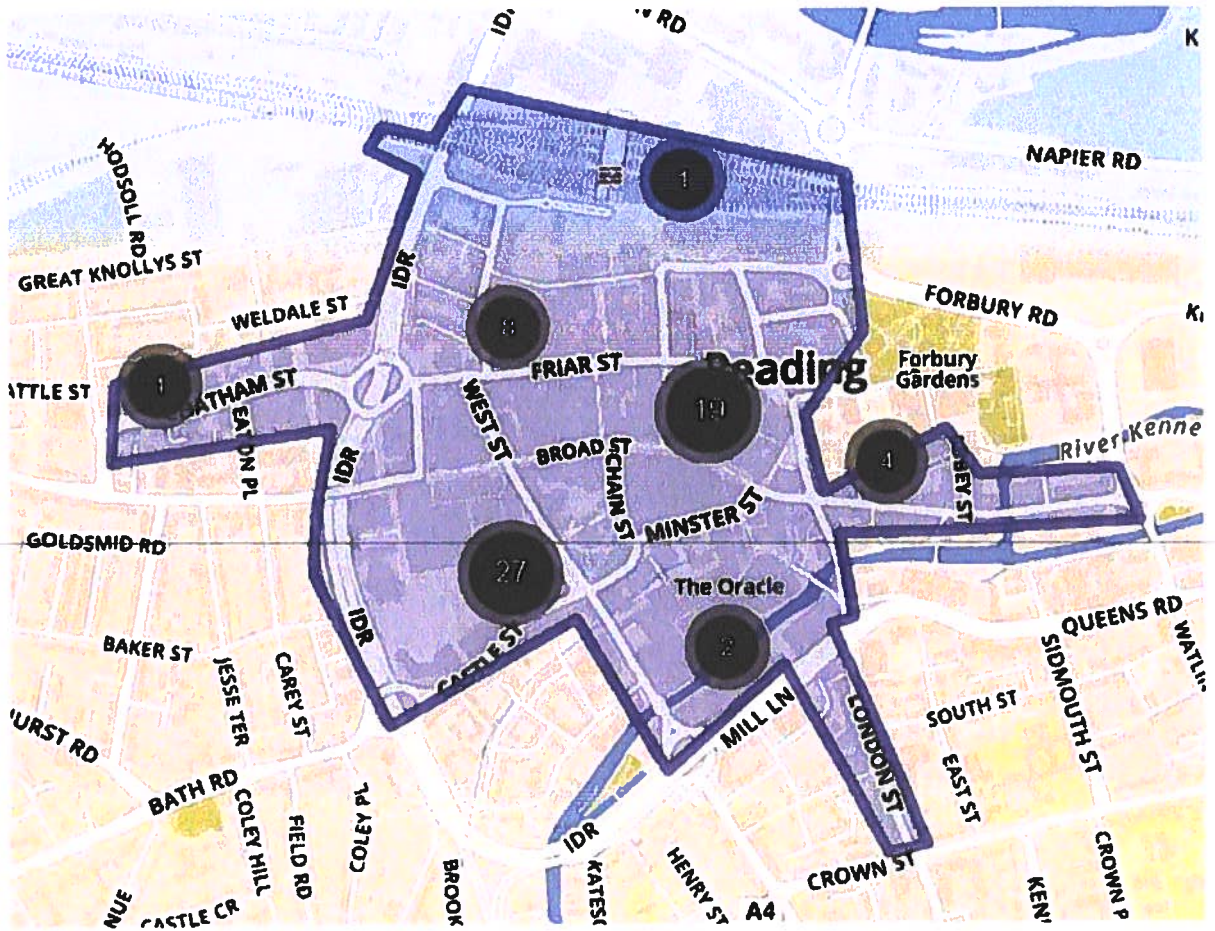
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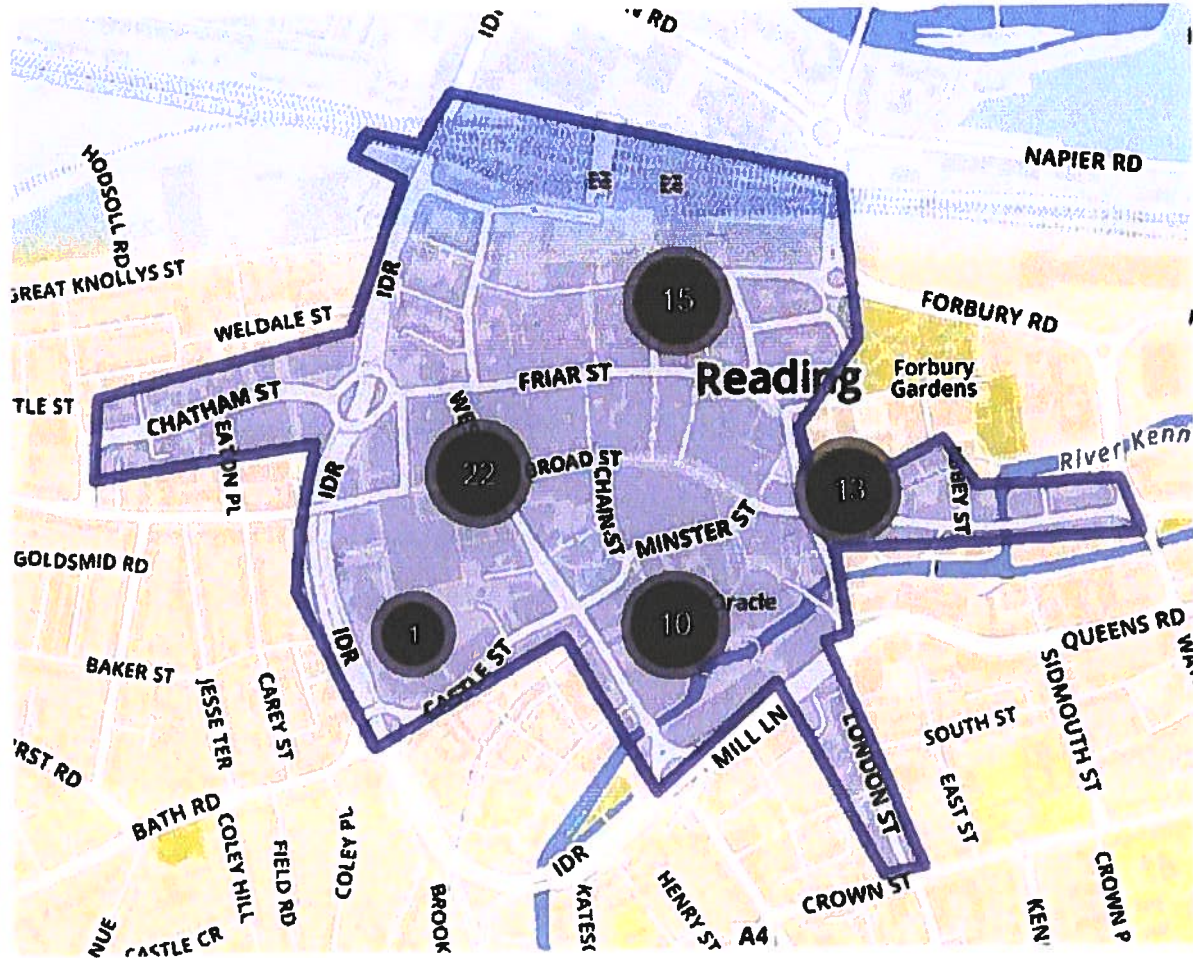
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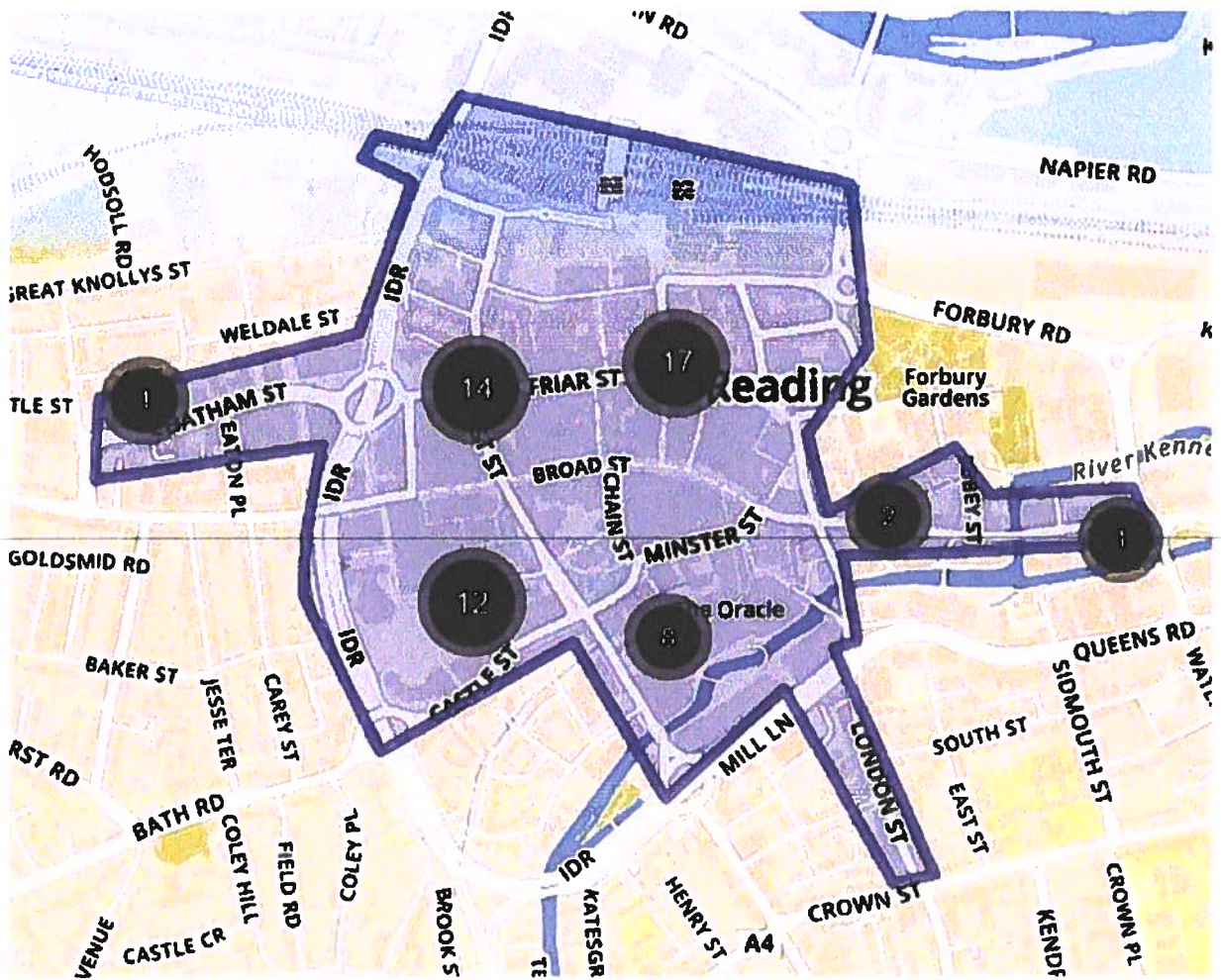

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to you in relation to the licensing application pending for the above premises. I would like to object against this licensing application.

I am the current holder of the licence for this premises to sell late night refreshments after 11pm. I did not surrender my licence. I am still paying and maintaining the licence. I am currently unable to operate the premises as the operator licence was not issued to me by the church. The church has been given the Hut by the Reading Brough Council over 100 years ago but the Reading Brough Council still own the land.

In 2018 April there was a dispute between the new church administration and myself, they have decided unfairly not issue the operators licence to my name. They did not recognise the Reading brough councils recommendation to issue the operators licence to me. I have put a very advantageous business plan that was in the favour of the Church but due their arrogance they did not accept it. They have rented the operators licence to some other people but the people were not successful and they gave it up after 12 months. Now the premises has been rented out to another operator, to my competitors in the trade. They are proposing the same business as me and wants to operate the same hours. I was the original founder of the kebab trade in the premises. I have never given up the licence and neither given my consent. The current operator has contacted number of people in the community and offer to sublet the their licence for cash - this is unlawful to my knowledge. I am hoping to operate the business again, I am hoping that the Reading Brough Council will take back the place from the Church and allow me to operate my licence and my trading rights in this premises.

I have operated that business responsibly without any disorder since 1998. In 1996, I was serving in a kebab van outside the Hut but the operator of the Hut at that time asked me to move in to the Hut, and they asked for the church to approve - the church approved it. I have hold the license since 1998 and prove that I can be compliant with Health and Safety and keep te public in order around the Hut. I have never had any trouble , I have kept very good relationships with the other businesses and public around the hut. I have proved many years that I am the better and safer operator of the business. I would like to carry on with my business in the premises and I object the new licensing hours.
