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#### **BACKGROUND PAPER:**

Scarlett Murphy.

Ms Murphy states that she has spent almost 10 years teaching in school and working as a subject leader and Assistant Head and enjoyed being able to support her team in supporting children and their learning in the most effective way. She would like to continue doing this and be able to support primary schools with the ever-changing curriculum and demands of teaching. The children's mental wellbeing and learning should always be an educator's priority and she is very keen to continue supporting the children in her local community. In her current position at the University, her role is working with trainee teachers and carrying out school visits to support their development. She has been in this position for a year and a half and strongly believe that it is in the best interests of the trainees, and consequently children, for her to ensure she is up to date with how schools are running, any changes to curriculum and how best to support primary pupils. She does not feel that she can train them sufficiently for a teaching job if she is not familiar with current practices. She hopes to be able to provide local schools with NQTs who are up to date with any changes and feel prepared to support their school and the children in future.

As a former member of the SLT, she has had the benefit of leading a range of subjects, including Maths, Computing and English. In these positions, she has spent

time working with colleagues to develop the curriculum, complete learning walks, monitor learning in books and complete pupil interviews. She believes that she can continue to share her expertise to support schools with this as a Governor.

In her positions as Assistant Head, she worked with the rest of the SLT to complete and implement the Schools Improvement Plans, ensuring that she worked with her team to meet challenging goals while teaching, This takes time and care to support the teachers who are already extremely busy as well as manage her own time, teaching full time. She assisted in interviewing teachers and designing new ways to assess children in foundation subjects. With the changes to the curriculum coming, she believes this is something that all schools will be working on and therefore she would be able to work with them to support this.

She has experienced numerous Ofsted visits as a member of SLT in school and also in her current position at the University, where they trialled the new inspection framework for ITT. Consequently, they have had to be mindful and adapt their teaching and modules to ensure that the trainee teachers are prepared for these visits and to deliver the new framework within school.

She has continued to lead recruitment on the Primary PGCE and BA Ed (QTS) course in her role and spend a large amount of time supporting trainees in school. Due to a strong knowledge of the primary curriculum she has managed to support her Academic Tutees and her students on placement in planning and teaching lessons and support school mentors in their role. She believes that as a Governor, having an understanding of the current teacher training courses will enable her to further support students on placement and schools in supporting their needs. She also leads the NQT conference at the university and therefore work with the LA to support their training.

She believes that having experience of teaching and the curriculum and training teachers will ensure that she can contribute in her role as a governor.
