Spring Booster Programme



- Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) advised an extra spring dose as a precautionary measure.
- The Spring Booster offered to those:
 - aged 75 years and over
 - in older people's care homes
 - aged 12 years and over with a weakened immune system
- Programme period 21 March 2022 to 30 June 2022.
- After 30 June Spring Booster still available to:
 - aged 75 years and over up to 30 June 2022
 - in older people's care homes up to 30 June 2022
 - aged 12 years and over with a weakened immune system

- 100% of care homes visited.
- National data systems do not clearly identify Spring Booster take up amongst the immunosuppressed (being their 5th dose as opposed to the 4th dose for all other people).
- A local search identified 42% Spring Booster take-up amongst the immunosuppressed in Berkshire West.
- A national letter was published on 13 June, setting out steps for primary care networks and secondary care clinicians to ensure that all immunosuppressed people are identified and offered a booster during the Spring Campaign. Primary care clinicians were asked identify and invite eligible immunosuppressed individuals for Spring Boosters by 27 June.

Autumn Planning



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- Expected vaccine offer to:
 - · residents in a care home for older adults and staff
 - frontline health and social care workers
 - all those 65 years of age and over
 - adults aged 16 to 64 years who are in a clinical risk group
- Important elements:
 - Co-adminsitration with other vaccines where possible
 - Planning to deal with any surges
 - Create opportunities to improve population health where possible, e.g. health promotion advice
- Key deadlines:
 - Primary Care Networks and Community Pharmacies to decide whether to participate in Autumn programme by mid-July
 - System plans to be submitted by the end of July
