1. Title of decision:	To award the Contract for the Provision of Concrete Road Surfacing Works 2024 Under the Project Amber Framework.
2. Date of the decision:	14 March 2024
3. The decision maker:	Executive Director of Economic Growth and Neighbourhood Services

4. Decision details: It has been decided to award a works contract following the approved Waiver CPR 12.7 (viii) "where the council wishes to undertake a compliant direct award from a framework that was established by means of competition and in accordance with the Regulations, and where the terms of the framework compliantly permit such an approach." to Miles Macadam Limited who will act as RBC 's contractor for support and supply the Concrete Road Surfacing Works Scheme. The contract duration will be up to ½ or 1 year.

5. Reasons for the decision: To enter the Amber Framework Contract with clauses of the NEC4 Engineering and Construction Short Contract June 2017 edition which starts from January 2024 and ends in June 2024.
RBC have no access fees to pay for using the Blackpool Amer Framework, which allows all of the capital grant funding to be used within the surfacing programme.

5. Alternative options considered (if any) and rejected:
There are no alternatives options.

The Council are unable to supply in-house construction works as no equipment and tools for road surfacing.

The Contract is following the Blackpool Amber Framework.
