2. Date of the decision:	13 October 2025

4. Decision details:

It is the decision of the Assistant Director of Policy, Change & Customer Services, in consultation with the Director of Resources and the Leader of the Council, that £302,400 of the £1,992,735.18 Household Support Fund 7 (HSF7) allocation to Reading from the Department for Work & Pensions be utilised in a manner consistent with the allocation decision taken by Policy Committee on 8th July 2024 for the Household Support Fund 5 allocation.

That the Assistant Director for Policy and Performance, in consultation with the Lead Councillor for Corporate Services and Resources and the Director of Finance, is delegated to make arrangements for any further funding rounds of the Household Support Fund.

This decision is taken under the delegation approved for the HSF5 grant at the Policy Committee as the HSF7 grant is defined by DWP as an extension of the HSF5.

Specifically, this includes the following Cost of Living support within Reading:

5. Reasons for the decision:

The objective of the Household Support Fund is to provide crisis support to vulnerable households in most need with the cost of essentials. The fund should help those who are struggling to afford household essentials including energy and water bills, food, and wider essentials. The proposed use of the funding meets these objectives, although the Council continues to seek to support residents before they are in crisis.

The HSF7 scheme within Reading is designed to provide a wide range of flexible support to low-income families across the borough. This support includes providing vouchers to households with Pupil Premium children, an application element to provide direct financial support to low-income households, additional targeted Early Years provision for two-year-olds, and funding to local voluntary and community organisations providing cost-of-living support.

In addition to this, the Council committed to providing financial support to pensioner households during the winter by providing each eligible household with a payment of £200. The eligibility for this payment was centred on low-income pensioner households who did not meet the new threshold for receiving the Winter Fuel Allowance.

However, following the decision by Government to extend the eligibility of the Winter Fuel Allowance to its previous level, all the pensioner households will now be receiving this support directly from the Government.

Whilst it remains an option to make this payment using HSF funding, there is the potential to reallocate the remaining funding to support other households in 2025/6.

Currently there is also **£123,000** of Contingency Funds available within the HSF7 budget. This brings the total amount of available funding to **£307,400**.

The options presented above have a total value of **£302,400** and have been developed with input from Housing and Council Tax teams, along with options for the VCS to utilise the available resources within the budget in a way that is consistent with both the statutory guidance for the HSF and the Council's existing approach to providing cost-of-living support within the borough.

The Household Support Fund allocation to Reading Borough is for 1st April 2025 to 31st March 2026. All funding allocated to the council needs to be spent within this timeframe and cannot be carried forward to future years.

6. Alternative options considered (if any) and rejected:

Alternative options for service provision and funding allocations of the grant were considered however they were rejected as the allocations and method used for this and previous HSF rounds have found to be effective, and it is important to quickly commence the delivery of the grant, which would be delayed significantly if alternative options had to be implemented.

Resources from the Household Support Fund can be utilised by residents to improve the energy efficiency of their homes and therefore reduce their energy costs.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND INFORMATION

The Council has routinely engaged with local voluntary and community organisations to understand the impact they are experiencing in supporting residents with the rising cost of living within the borough. This engagement has enabled the Council to tailor the information and support available to residents who are struggling with the rising cost of living.

The development of the approach and criteria for the application-based element of the Household Support Fund have been guided by the feedback from local voluntary and community organisations on how the rising cost of living can affect residents from a broad range of backgrounds and personal circumstances. For example, over half of the residents being referred to support from the Readifood foodbank are single people living alone.

EQUALITY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

A full Equality Impact Assessment has been completed for the entire utilisation of the HSF4 grant from DWP. There are no additional equalities impacts to note.

The Household Support Fund is focused on supporting any resident who is experiencing difficulties with the rising cost of living within the borough.

Opportunities to access support from the Household Support fund have been widely promoted across the borough to ensure everyone is aware of them, including to local voluntary and community organisations who have a direct relationship with local communities across the borough.

Elements of the Household Support Fund which are targeted towards families eligible for free school meals are also expected to support other protected characteristics within the borough.

The delegated decision, alongside previous decisions, utilises £1,992,735.18 HSF7 grant provided to the Council. There is no impact on the Council's revenue budget.
